Commissioner Donaldson made a motion to approve the 401(a) Participation Agreement between Logan County and Colorado County Officials and Employees Retirement Association

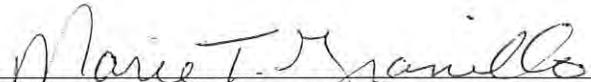

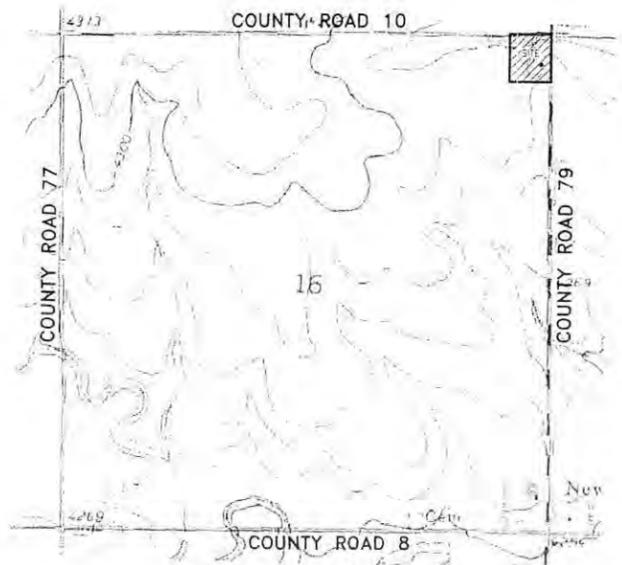
