Minutes to the Meeting

Members in Attendance: Bobby Juchem, Gina Robinson (via telephone), Bob Gall, and Terri Krupke (via telephone), Mark Simon (via telephone), Ryan Carson (via telephone), Peter Pike (via telephone).

CONVENE:

Meeting Convened at 9:16 a.m. by Bobby Juchem.

Minutes:

- The minutes of the October 26, 2015 meeting were read and approved by unanimous vote.

Request for release of “PONYRDE”:

Bob Gall presented the case on behalf of the Citizen for releasing the plate back to them. Mark wanted to see some evidence to support their claim (death certificates etc.) Mark also thought that LPAG needed to create a written policy for this type of thing in the future for consistency. There was a brief discussion around the Department of Revenue’s concerns as to whether collecting death certificates, etc. would violate HIPPA, LeeAnn didn’t think so. Bobby opted to table this discussion until the next meeting and Bob would contact the citizen for further information.

JAG Investigation:

- LeeAnn updated the group indicating that the PO has been issued; however in the meantime the specific JAG Arbitrator is no longer interested in reviewing/investigating the case. A new Arbitrator, Judge Moorehead expressed interest at \$360/hour. LeeAnn was going to meet with him the next business day.
- Peter expressed his disappointment that it has taken so long.

- Bobby clarified the circumstance and why it has taken as long as it had to move forward and believed the investigation still had value.
- Peter continued to express frustration and not moving forward.
- Bobby and LeeAnn clarified the P.O. process and explained that even if the investigation was complete, LPAG still was not in a position to auction off plates as things currently stand. The Governor's office wants to see the results of the investigation before moving forward.

Future Meeting Schedule:

The 2016 meeting schedule was handed out to the committee. Bobby confirmed the 1/25, 2/29, 3/28, 4/25 and 5/23 meetings but wanted to hold off on the rest as the legislative session would have ended by then and there would then be further direction about the makeup of LPAG and whether it would continue in its current format.

Future Agenda Items:

Bobby believed that future items of discussion at the upcoming meetings would be "PONYRDE", and what various Bill(s) concerning LPAG might look like.

Public Testimony:

Kit Sage had nothing.

Corey Krause discussed his marketing strategy background and interest in Personalized License Plates and being involved in several car clubs and that he was trying to get a feel for what LPAG was and where they were.

Bobby adjourned the meeting at 9:58 a.m.
