



## Fact Sheet: House Bill 16-1415 implementation

### General Information

---

House Bill 16-1415 (HB16-1415) establishes new fees for DMV services and allows Colorado Road and Community Safety Act (CO-RCSA) driver license applicants who fail a drive test during their appointment to take advantage of third party schools and return to one of the three Driver License Offices offering CO-RCSA services on a space available basis.

The new fees will be in effect on July 1, 2016 and are intended to decrease the subsidy necessary to fully fund the DMV Driver Services appropriation. Fees associated with the CO-RCSA fund the direct and indirect costs associated with providing these services.

Individuals who failed a driving test during a CO-RCSA appointment that took place after May 4, 2016 may return to a CO-RCSA office on a space available basis beginning June 15, 2016. The new law specifies individuals have the option of taking the driving test at a 3rd party school within 60 days of failing the test at the driver license office. Once they pass the test at a third party school, individuals then have 180 days to return to an office that offers CO-RCSA services and present their passing certificate, identification documentation used to obtain their permit, valid instruction permit and proof of Colorado residence and pay a \$15 retest fee.

### Fees

---

From July 1, 2016 - June 30, 2017, the following is a list of fees for DMV driver services. Fees that are changing are in **bold**.

- **Driver License** **\$26**
- Instruction Permit (Includes motorcycle) \$16.80
- **Driving Record** **\$9**
- **Certified Driving Record** **\$10**
- **Duplicate Permit or Minor Driver License** **\$12 for first duplicate** and \$16 for additional
- **Driver License Extension** **\$6.50**
- Identification Card (under 60 Years Old) \$11.50
- Identification Card (over 60 years old) FREE
- Written Test (Retest) \$11.15
- Drive Test (Retest) \$15
- Colorado Road and Community Safety Act
  - Driver License \$79.58
  - Instruction Permit \$48.19
  - Identification Card \$26.68

### SB13-251 Retest Option

---

If an applicant for a CO-RCSA driver license fails the driving test, the applicant may retake the driving test from a vendor approved by the department. The applicant must pass the third party-administered driving test within 60 days after failing the driving test during their appointment. Within 180 days after completing the third party drive test, the applicant may then return to one of the three driver license offices authorized to issue CO-RCSA identification on a space available basis to obtain a driver license. (C.R.S. 42-2-511 (3))


This new option is applicable to an individual who:

- Made an appointment taking place at an office offering CO-RCSA services after May 4, 2016
- Successfully obtained an instruction permit, but failed the driving test during their appointment

An individual who chooses to use this option must:

- Re-take the driving test at a qualified 3rd party drive school within 60 days of the driver license appointment at which the individual initially failed the drive test, (See <https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/sites/default/files/BOSTschools.pdf>)
- Within 180 days of passing the driving test at the third party school, return to a driver license office that offers SB13-251 services and present:
  - The certificate from the driving school certifying the individual has passed the driving test within 60 days of the driver license appointment at which the individual initially failed the drive test
  - The individual's passport, military identification card or consular card used to obtain their instruction permit
  - The individual's valid Colorado instruction permit
  - A document demonstrating the individual's current Colorado residential address (if address is different from the one on the instruction permit. See <https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/dmv/proof-address> for examples of acceptable documents)
  - Applicable fee (\$79.58 for the driver license and \$15 for the drive test retest)
