



Home and Community Based Services – Persons who are Elderly, Blind and Disabled Waiver Fact Sheet

Overview & Services

EBD is an HCBS waiver service option that allows Medicaid clients who meet the following criteria to access services in a home or community setting:

- ✓ 65 and over
 - ✓ Disabled individuals 18 and over
 - ✓ Individuals deemed legally blind that are 18 and over
 - ✓ Individuals diagnosed with HIV/AIDS that are 18 and over
- Clients 65 and over must meet functional criteria determined by their Single Entry Point Case Manager.
 - Client must meet financial criteria determined by their local Department of Human Services Social Worker.
 - An individual's income must be less than \$2,199 (300% SSI) per month
 - Their countable resources must be less than \$2,000.00 for a single person and \$3,000.00 for a couple.
 - There is not a waiting list.
 - Clients can self-direct their care through Consumer Directed Attendant Support Services (CDASS) or In-Home Support Services (IHSS).
 - Clients have Case Managers from their local single entry point monitor their eligibility, services and providers.
 - Frequency of services are based off needs determined at the time of assessment.

The following services are offered through the HCBS-EBD Waiver:

- Personal Care
- Home Modification
- Homemaker
- Alternative Care Facilities
- Adult Day Services
- Specialized Adult Day Care
- Non-Medical Transportation
- Colorado Choice Transitions
- Personal Emergency Response System
- Medication Reminder
- Respite
- CDASS
- IHSS
