



Medicaid Buy-In Program for Working Adults with Disabilities (Adult Buy-In) Benefit Update

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) waiver access for Adult Buy-In

- All clients in the Adult Buy-In program will continue to receive Regular Medicaid benefits
- HCBS benefits are now available to qualified clients in the Adult Buy-In program through the Elderly, Blind and Disabled (EBD) or Community Mental Health Supports (CMHS) waiver, effective December 1, 2012
- To receive the additional HCBS benefits through the Adult Buy-In, clients must:
 - Meet the eligibility criteria for the Adult Buy-In program;
 - Be at least 18 years old; AND
 - Meet the functional and targeting criteria for the EBD or CMHS waiver

Adult Buy-In Eligibility Determination

The application process for individuals seeking medical assistance through the Adult Buy-In program has not changed. Eligibility for the Adult Buy-In program is determined by an eligibility site: a [county department of human/social services](#) or a [Medical Assistance site](#). Functional Eligibility Determination for Adult Buy-In Clients

In addition to an eligibility determination for the Adult Buy-In, a functional assessment is required if HCBS benefits are needed.

A functional assessment will determine whether the client meets the functional and targeting criteria for the EBD or CMHS waiver in order to receive the additional benefits. This assessment can only be provided by a [Single Entry Point \(SEP\) agency](#).

- To receive a functional needs assessment for EBD or CMHS waiver benefits:
 - **Existing Adult Buy-In Clients:**
 - Contact a local [SEP agency](#) for a functional needs assessment
 - **New Applicants:**
 - Individuals seeking medical assistance through the Adult Buy-In should follow the application process outlined in the FAQs posted on the [Adult Buy-In Web page](#); AND
 - Contact a local [SEP agency](#) for a functional needs assessment if HCBS benefits are needed
 - **Existing Medicaid/HCBS Clients Transitioning to the Adult Buy-In:**
 - Existing clients whose situation is changing or expected to change should work with an eligibility technician to avoid potential gaps in coverage

 - Community transition services

 - Adult day services
 - Personal emergency response system
 - Home modifications
 - Non-medical transportation
 - Consumer Directed Attendant Supportive Services (CDASS)
 - Alternate care facilities
 - Personal care
 - Homemaker services
 - Respite care
