Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Update (CSEPP)

In accordance with public law which established the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program in 1985, our priority as directed by Congress remains –“...maximum protection for the environment, the general public, and the personnel involved.” Our responsibility extends to every inch of the county and every individual.

CSEPP MISSION

To achieve the congressional mandate, our mission is to “...enhance existing local, installation, state, and federal capabilities...”

CSEPP Accomplishments

- To date, the Pueblo community has leveraged resources to...
- Purchase critical equipment for first responders throughout the county
- Construct and equip a purpose-built facility in Pueblo to synchronize emergency management capabilities
- Construct and equip a purpose built facility at PCD to execute daily operations and support any potential emergency
- Enhance the communications infrastructure across the county
- Train personnel in a wide array of emergency management skills
- Conduct annual, large-scale training events to prepare the community for all hazards

- 3 new 911 Communications Officers are supported by the program
- John Riley joins as the Pueblo County CSEPP Coordinator

- Continue to inform the public, focusing on preparedness and risk reduction
- Prepare for changes to the program at the end of the chemical surety mission

- Maintain capabilities at, or above, current levels until program end
