



How Much Radiation?



Key

- 1/100** Lifetime exposure correlates to a cancer occurrence of 1 in 100
- Annual exposure limit of a radiation worker
- Smoking 1.5 packs of cigarettes each day for one year
- CT scan
- Annual background exposure in Colorado
- Annual average U.S. background exposure
- Annual dose of cosmic radiation for someone living at 9,000 ft.
- Annual public exposure limit
- Mammogram
- Annual dose from terrestrial radiation for someone living in the Colorado Plateau
- Annual dose per person from food
- Average annual worker exposure at Cotter Uranium Mill (when operating)
- Average annual public exposure at fence line of Cotter Uranium Mill (calculated; when operating)
- Chest x-ray
- Flight from NYC to LA
- Dental x-ray
