

# End Users Fund Bulletin / Weight Ticket Requirements

October 2016  
(updated)

Effective May 1, 2016, applicants requesting a rebate from the End Users Fund for the end use, processing or retail sale of tire-derived products or waste tires must submit weight tickets meeting the minimum requirements outlined in this bulletin to be accepted as proof of weight.

## **What is the End Users Fund?**

The End Users Fund (the “Fund”) is a rebate program for those who end use tire-derived products or waste tires in Colorado, or, in limited instances, for those who process waste tires into tire-derived products, or sell tire-derived products in Colorado. Eligibility to receive rebates from the Fund is determined by section 30-20-1405, C.R.S. and the Regulations Pertaining to Solid Waste Sites and Facilities, 6 CCR 1007-2, Part 1, section 10.12.

## **Where can you obtain weight tickets as proof of weight for your Fund application?**

Weight tickets can be generated at certain commercial scales used in Colorado. Typically commercial scales are located at Colorado Port of Entry, truck stops/travel centers, landfills and private businesses.

## **Who regulates commercial scales in Colorado?**

Commercial scales are regulated by the Colorado Department of Agriculture under the requirements of the Colorado Measurements Standards Act, sections 35-14-101 through 35-14-134, C.R.S.

## **What is the minimum required information needed on each weight ticket?**

The Department requires the following minimum information on each weight ticket to be eligible to receive a rebate from the Fund:

1. The gross, tare and net weights (in pounds or tons);
2. Weight ticket number;
3. Delivery date of tire-derived products or whole waste tires;
4. Time in and time out of truck and/or trailer of tire-derived product or whole waste tires;
5. Vehicle identification (e.g., license plate number, truck ID, trailer number);
6. Name of company hauling tire-derived products or waste tires;
7. Description of tire-derived products or waste tires being hauled, sold and/or end used;
8. Name of company receiving tire-derived products or waste tires<sup>1</sup>;
9. Name and/or signature of driver of vehicle;
10. Name and/or signature of certified weigher (if applicable);
11. Name and location of the commercial scale.

## **What is a certified weigher?**

A certified weigher is a neutral third party who issues certificates of correct weight to businesses or individuals who need weight tickets for a certain commodity.

<sup>1</sup> The Department recognizes that if a hauler uses a commercial scale at a highway scale house or gas station, then the final destination is not printed on the weight ticket. In such cases, the lack of this information would not invalidate the application.

**Does the tire-derived material or waste tires have to be weighed by a certified weigher to qualify for a rebate from the Fund?**

No. An applicant can use a commercial scale that is privately owned by a company, but that scale must meet the requirements of the Colorado Measurements Standards Act, sections 35-14-101 through 35-14-134, C.R.S.

**Will the department accept a single stand-alone tare weight ticket for the same vehicle or trailer that is used multiple times in combination with gross weight tickets of the tire-derived products or waste tires?**

As of May 1, 2016, the department will no longer accept single stand-alone tare weight tickets for trucks and trailers used to haul multiple loads of tire-derived products or waste tires. Individual weight tickets must be generated for each load of tire-derived products or waste tires being claimed for a rebate from the Fund.

**Can an applicant obtain a gross weight from one commercial scale and a tare weight from another commercial scale as proof of weight?**

Yes. The two separate weight tickets should be stapled together and the applicant should include a statement explaining why two separate scales were used. The applicant should calculate the net weight of the tire-derived product(s) or waste tires for each set of weight tickets. The two scales should be reasonably located near each other (maximum 50 miles apart) and the time and dates on both tickets should be within 24 hours. The same truck and/or trailer must be used for both weight tickets.

**What other proof will the department accept if weight tickets are not available?**

An applicant should contact the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division to discuss other verifiable forms of documentation that may be acceptable on a case by case basis.
