



Health Impact on Lives: Health and Quality Improvement Subcommittee *Charter*

Vision: A health care delivery system that provides high value care to its members.

Mission: To improve the quality of health care delivery and experience for Accountable Care Collaborative (ACC) members.

Purpose: The subcommittee addresses health and quality outcomes within the ACC and serves as a platform to discuss and disseminate best practices and improvement strategies across the program. It also provides strategic insight and recommendations to the Performance Improvement Advisory Committee (PIAC) and the Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (the Department) on initiatives related to the quality of health care delivery and experience of ACC members. Person, issue, or event that caused the subcommittee to be established: The subcommittee was formed by PIAC in September 2011.

Objectives: The subcommittee has the following objectives:

- Discuss best practices and challenges to improving quality, experience, and health outcomes for ACC members;
- Respond to requests from PIAC and the Department to investigate topics and strategies related to focus areas;
- Make recommendations to PIAC and the Department regarding the quality of health care delivery and health improvement promotion; and
- Advocate for inclusion of members' experiences in the overall assessment of the ACC.

Focus Areas: In SFY 2017, the subcommittee has the following focus areas:

- ACC Program Measures and Best Practices: The subcommittee will facilitate conversations regarding best practices used to improve programmatic performance measures. Key measures include EPSDT and depression screening rates;
- Client Engagement and Activation: The subcommittee will assess the strategies used by regional collaborative care organizations (RCCOs) and the Department to encourage members to actively engage and participate in their care and will assist in the development of the appropriate measures to monitor and evaluate the success of these strategies;
- Health Literacy: The subcommittee will assess the strategies used by RCCOs and the Department to ensure that members are aware of and adequately understand their benefits and service options and will assist in the development of the appropriate measures to monitor and evaluate the success of these strategies; and
- Performance Data Transparency and Utilization: The subcommittee will assist in the development of new strategies to publish programmatic performance data and to increase its consumption among RCCOs, key programmatic stakeholders, and the broader public.

Major Functions: In SFY 2017, the subcommittee will accomplish its objectives within its focus areas through the following activities:

- Discuss, monitor, and recommend improvement and innovation strategies regarding key performance indicators (KPIs) and additional quality measures;

- Discuss and review current RCCO strategies to improve KPIs and quality measures, including EPSDT and depression screenings;
- Identify and recommend innovative strategies positively impacting performance to be scaled across the ACC;
- Engage ACC members and stakeholders to gain insight into member experience with and understanding of their health care benefits and their health neighborhood;
 - Discuss and review current RCCO strategies to engage members in health care delivery;
 - Identify Department resources to support member engagement strategies;
 - Assist in the development of measures to assess the success of member engagement strategies;
- Develop strategies and recommendations to increase publication and use of ACC programmatic data;
 - Provide strategic feedback and recommendations on the design and functionality of the Department's new business intelligence and data management (BIDM) tools; and
 - Develop and recommend strategies to increase the consumption of programmatic performance data by RCCOs, key programmatic stakeholders, and the broader public.

Findings of the subcommittee will be reported to: PIAC and the Department.
