#### DISCLOSURE OF POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Disclosures of Potential Conflicts of Interest: Attorney Tanaka advised the Board that, pursuant to Colorado law, certain disclosures may be required prior to taking official action at the meeting. The Board reviewed the Agenda for the meeting, following which Directors Krayenhagen, Fleck, Polliard, Rogers and Wyckoff each confirmed that they had no conflicts of interest in connection with any of the matters listed on the Agenda.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

Agenda: Ms. Johnson distributed for the Board's review and approval a proposed Agenda for the District's special meeting.

## RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

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Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Wyckoff, seconded by Director Polliard and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Agenda was approved.

**Board of Directors' Report:** There was nothing new to report.

**Manager's Report:** Ms. Johnson presented and the Board reviewed the January Manager's Report.

**District Website:** The Board entered into discussion regarding the status of the District's website. Due to unanticipated demand on their resources and backlogs of projects, the Statewide Internet Portal Authority ("SIPA") is still working on the creation of the District's website. SIPA expects the wait to be approximately two months.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Rogers, seconded by Director Fleck and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the consent agenda items.

### **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

#### **Evaporation Ponds:**

**Concentrate Management Efforts:** Ms. Bollinger reported to the Board that Olsson Associates, Inc. clarified the importance of pond monitoring to Ramey Environmental Compliance, Inc. ("REC"). She noted that the monitoring is necessary to determine how the valves are operating and make comparisons between field data and what is shown on SCADA. She noted that REC will better document the levels and take photographs of the stakes during site visits. Ms. Bollinger reported that as of December 17, 2012 the SCADA has a pond depth of 4.25 feet. REC continues to monitor the depth of the water.

## RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

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Location and Costs to Acquire Land for Third Evaporation Pond: Ms. Bollinger reported that Olsson Associates, Inc. is awaiting a response from Adams County for a meeting date to determine if the area just north of the current ponds is an acceptable location for the new, third pond.

Energy Audit: Ms. Bollinger noted that the accounts with United Power may now be changed to coincide with the change in operations, thereby reducing the monthly energy costs. The Board directed staff to make the appropriate changes with United Power.

Engineering, Design and Operations Plan (“EDOP”): Ms. Bollinger reported that the EDOP was submitted to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment on December 21, 2012.

GIS Mapping Project: Ms. Bollinger noted that comments have been incorporated into the final maps.

VFD Enclosures: Timber Line Electric and Controls Corporation made a program change that should protect the VFDs during periods of cold weather and low temperatures. Olsson Associates, Inc. suggests monitoring the VFDs through another winter to determine if the programming will be sufficient.

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### OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE MATTERS

Operations and Maintenance Update: The Board reviewed the Monthly Activities Report and operations and maintenance update. A copy of the report is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Monthly Flow Report: The Board reviewed the monthly flow report covering November 5, 2012 through December 5, 2012.

Water Quality Issues in Box Elder Creek Ranch and Rocking Horse Farms: The Board reviewed the monthly water quality report.

## Item IV.A. – Evaporation Ponds

1. Status of concentrate management efforts – Olsson Associates conducted a conference call with REC to clarify the importance of pond level monitoring. It was explained we are monitoring the levels for two purposes, first to determine how the valves are operating and second to compare what is seen in the field with what is shown on SCADA. REC said they would better document the levels and would take pictures of the stakes during each site visit.

As of 12/17/12 the SCADA has a pond depth of 4.25 ft. REC is monitoring the depths.

2. Third evaporation pond – Based on the last Board meeting Olsson Associates is scheduling a meeting with the County to determine if the area north of the existing ponds is a go or no-go area. Olsson has sent the county proposed meeting dates and is awaiting a response.

## Item IV.B. – Discuss steps to implement changes determined by the energy audit

Since TLECC has changed the internal clock on the PLC the system to match daylight savings, the system has been operating within the appropriate time frames.

It will be important to continue monitoring the system after the change to ensure proper operation. In particular, during the summer operation when more demand is placed on the system.

## Item IV.C – Status of Engineering Design and Operations Plan

- The HMWMD has responded and attached are the responses.
  - The District is exempt from submitting the Inventory and Preliminary Classification Report (IPCR).
  - The EDOP is considered “Complete” by the HMWMD, but still requires a technical review after final submittal.

- The HMWMD also provided preliminary comments from their completeness review in an unofficial email. Attached are their comments.
- Olsson Associates is reviewing the report to ensure all comments are addressed and are prepared to submit the report to the State by the January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2013 deadline.

#### Item IV.D – Status of GIS Mapping

Olsson Associates received scanned copies of the pages with comments and are in the process of revising the sheets. Two revised booklets will be distributed at the Board meeting one for the field and one for the District office records.

#### Item IV.E – Status of VFD enclosures

Olsson Associates has been in discussions with Dan LaCoe, Ramey Environmental, and Timber Line regarding the VFD's. Based on the conversations it is recommended to continue using the cold weather programming and see how it handles this winter.

Timber Line is speaking with Cutler Hammer to determine if there is a panel better suited for the operating conditions, but at this time it is believed the cold weather programming should be sufficient. If no problems arise this winter then the District does not have a problem. If something were to go wrong, the District has enough storage in the system to allow for a couple of days of downtime until the well(s) could be fixed.

Attached is an email which outlines the full discussion with Timber Line and Olsson.

#### Additional Engineering Matters

Olsson Associates completed the one-year warranty inspection on the exterior of the north tank at Box Elder Creek Ranch. The memo summarizing the inspection along with photos is attached.

I will attend the January 3, 2012 Board Meeting and will be prepared to address any of these items, as well as any additional items that may arise.

On October 11, 2012, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division (Division), received from Greatrock North Water and Sanitation District (Greatrock), in Adams County, Colorado, a request to waive (Waiver Request) (Olsson 2012a) the submittal of an *Inventory and Preliminary Classification Report (IPCR)* as required by Section 9.1.8 (A) of the Regulations Pertaining to Solid Waste Sites and Facilities, 6 CCR 1007-2, Part 1 (Solid Waste Regulations). The Waiver Request was prepared for Greatrock by its technical consultant, Olsson Associates (Olsson), and is dated October 11, 2012. On September 5, 2012, Greatrock had submitted a proposed *Engineering Design and Operation Plan (EDOP)* (Olsson 2012b) for on-site Type B Waste Impoundments. Since the *EDOP* (Olsson 2012b) presents the information that would be presented in an *IPCR*, Greatrock has submitted the Waiver Request (Olsson 2012a).

The Division has completed its review of the Waiver Request (Olsson 2012a) pursuant to the appropriate provisions of the Solid Waste Regulations, and hereby **approves** the Waiver Request (Olsson 2012a).

On September 5, 2012, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Hazardous Materials and Waste Management Division (Division), received from Greatrock North Water and Sanitation District (Greatrock), in Adams County, Colorado, a proposed *Engineering Design and Operation Plan (EDOP)* (Olsson 2012), prepared for Greatrock by its technical consultant, Olsson Associates (Olsson), and dated August 2012. On Greatrock's behalf, Olsson prepared the *EDOP* (Olsson 2012) to meet the requirements for a Type B Waste Impoundment as set forth in the revised Section 9 – Waste Impoundments of the Regulations Pertaining to Solid Waste Sites and Facilities, 6 CCR 1007-2, Part 1 (Solid Waste Regulations).

The Division reviewed the Application to determine its compliance with the requirements set forth in the Solid Waste Disposal Sites and Facilities Act, Colorado Revised Statutes (CRS) Title 30, Article 20, Parts 1 and 10 (Solid Waste Act), as amended, and with the Solid Waste Regulations promulgated there under. Although not required by the Solid Waste Regulations, the Division will follow the Certification of Designation (CD) process during its technical and regulatory review of an EDOP. In accordance with the Solid Waste Statute, CRS 30-20-103 (2), a "completeness review" of an application for a CD is required. Typically, an application for a CD includes an EDOP for review. While Greatrock is not applying for a CD, Greatrock has submitted an EDOP for review. Therefore, as noted above the Division will follow the general process of issuing a completeness review before issuing the results of a "technical evaluation" as noted below. The Division has conducted the completeness review and has determined the *EDOP*

(Olsson 2012) to be **complete**. Please note that it is not the intent or purpose of a “completeness review” to imply anything concerning the final approval (or disapproval) of the *EDOP* (Olsson 2012).

In accordance with the general process outlined in the Solid Waste Statute, CRS 30-20-103 (2), a “technical evaluation” is required after the completeness review has been conducted, and the Division has initiated the technical evaluation process. The Division might request additional information in order to clarify aspects of the *EDOP* (Olsson 2012) before completing the technical evaluation. A formal recommendation of approval (or disapproval) of the Application per the Solid Waste Regulations will be made after the Division has completed its technical review.

The Division is authorized to bill for its review of technical submittals at \$125 per hour, pursuant to Section 1.7 of the Solid Waste Regulations. The fee ceiling is \$35,000 for the review of your Application, and the review can include time for the completeness review, the technical evaluation, associated meetings, other communications, and any other related items. An invoice for the Division’s review of the subject document will be sent under separate cover.

- Section A-12 – Nuisance Conditions:** As defined in Section 1.2 of the Solid Waste Regulations, nuisance conditions might result from explosive gas, bird hazards, disease vectors, odors, windblown solid wastes or cover materials, open burning, water pollution, air pollution, noise pollution, and traffic congestion. Please revise this section as necessary to address the nuisance conditions relevant to Greatrock.
- Section C – Facility Design:** The ponds are lined with a 30-mil PVC geomembrane that was installed in 2004. The PVC geomembrane is overlain by 12 inches of cover soil. Generally, PVC is a suitable option for a pond liner. Since PVC is made by adding plasticizers, however, the PVC can break down over time and become brittle. Because (1) the PVC geomembrane was installed fairly recently; (2) underneath the ponds there is an existing clay layer, approximately 4 feet thick, under the ponds and above the underlying alluvial aquifer; and (3) pond water contamination levels appear favorable, the Division might find the existing ponds to be acceptable provided that there is adequate leak detection and ground water monitoring. As noted above, over time the PVC geomembrane might degrade to the point where leaks are detected, and the PVC geomembrane probably would need to be replaced at that time. In such a case, the Division would evaluate a proposed replacement liner in light of the regulations, industry standards, and the like that would be in place at that time.
- Section E-5 – Personnel Training Plan:** Section 9.3.4 (E) (5) of the Solid Waste Regulations requires that shall include a personnel training plan that includes the listed provisions. Please revise this section to address the need for a Personnel Training Plan as well as providing and documenting the training.

4. **Section F – Closure Plan:** Section 9.3.4 (F) of the Solid Waste Regulations requires the inclusion of a Closure Plan in the EDOP. This requirement applies whether or not the facility is anticipated to close at any time in the future. The Closure Plan would include current third-party cost estimates that would be available to the Division to close the site in the event that the Division were required to do so. The third-party cost estimates form the basis of providing financial assurance (please also see Comment 5).

**Section F – Closure Plan:** Section 9.3.3 (J) of the Solid Waste Regulations requires that financial assurance be provided in accordance with Section 1.8 of the Solid Waste Regulations. Financial assurance must be provided by **DATE.**

Brad and I have been discussing the VFD's at the alluvial wells with TLECC. Below are some answers to questions we had from the board meeting along with a recap of the meeting with Anthony. I have highlighted action items at the top of this email for easy reference.

### Answers to questions from the board meeting 12/4/2012:

- VFD's are rated for 14°-104°F
- The enclosures which house the VFD's do not offer any additional heating/cooling protection

### Discussion recap:

1. Determine what JR Engineering spec'd vs. what they approved through submittals
  - a. OA will investigate their copies of JR Engineering files
  - b. OA will ask SDMS to investigate their records
  - c. TLECC will investigate their records
2. TLECC mentioned when the alluvial 'failed' two years ago it was never determined cold weather was the cause.
3. Last year the cold weather programming installed, to prevent the VFD from freezing, wasn't tested at our site because the winter was mild.
4. TLECC thinks, and OA agrees, we should continue using the cold weather programming and see how they handle this winter since the cause of the failure isn't 100% known and the District has a buffer in their system with storage capacity.
  - a. It was discussed, if there is an issue with the cold weather programming a new panel rated for the colder temperatures, if available, would be a better option for the VFD's when compared to a custom made enclosure or insulating the existing unit.
  - b. In the meantime, TLECC is going to call Cutler Hammer to see if they have a panel that would be better suited for the cold weather in case the programming does fail we have a back-up option.
  - c. If we do pursue a custom enclosure or insulating the existing panel, TLECC recommends communicating with Cutler Hammer to see if they have any suggestions or thoughts.
5. OA will ask if REC can document the date, time, operation status, and weather conditions if something were to fail at the alluvial wells as it will help us determine the true cause of a failure.

Greatrock North Water and Sanitation District's (District) 500,000 gallon north storage tank at Box Elder Creek Ranch has been in operation since December 24, 2011.

On November 2, 2012 Olsson Associates contacted the District's operator, Ramey Environmental Compliance (REC), to see if they were aware of any issues at the site, see attached email. REC said they did not have any issues at this time.

On November 7, 2012, Olsson Associates performed an inspection of the site around the exterior of the north tank. While at the site it was noticed the ditch at the outfall of the tank drain was full of sediment. While not an issue during day to day operations should the tank need to be drained the ditch culverts will need to be cleaned so as to prevent water from overtopping the ditch banks. Photos from the site visit are included at the end of this memo. The top picture on page four shows the sediment filled ditch.

Olsson Associates performed a follow-up phone call with REC on December 13, 2012 to verify there were still no issues with the north tank at Box Elder Creek Ranch. REC restated they were not aware of any issues at the site.

On December 17, 2012 Olsson Associates performed a final inspection of the site around the exterior of the north tank. No new items were identified at this time. Pictures of the visual inspection are included in this memo. The warranty for the tank expires on December 24, 2012 should something happen to the tank prior to the 24<sup>th</sup> please contact Brad Simons or myself immediately so the issue can be addressed.

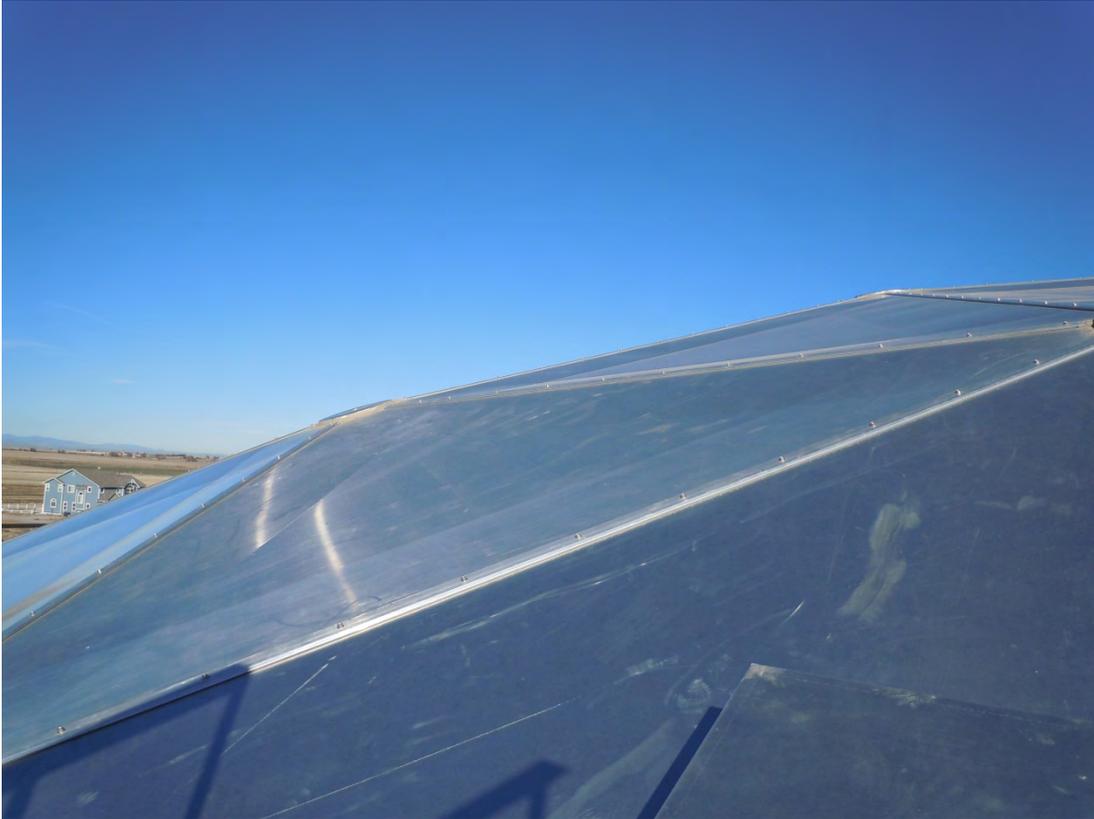

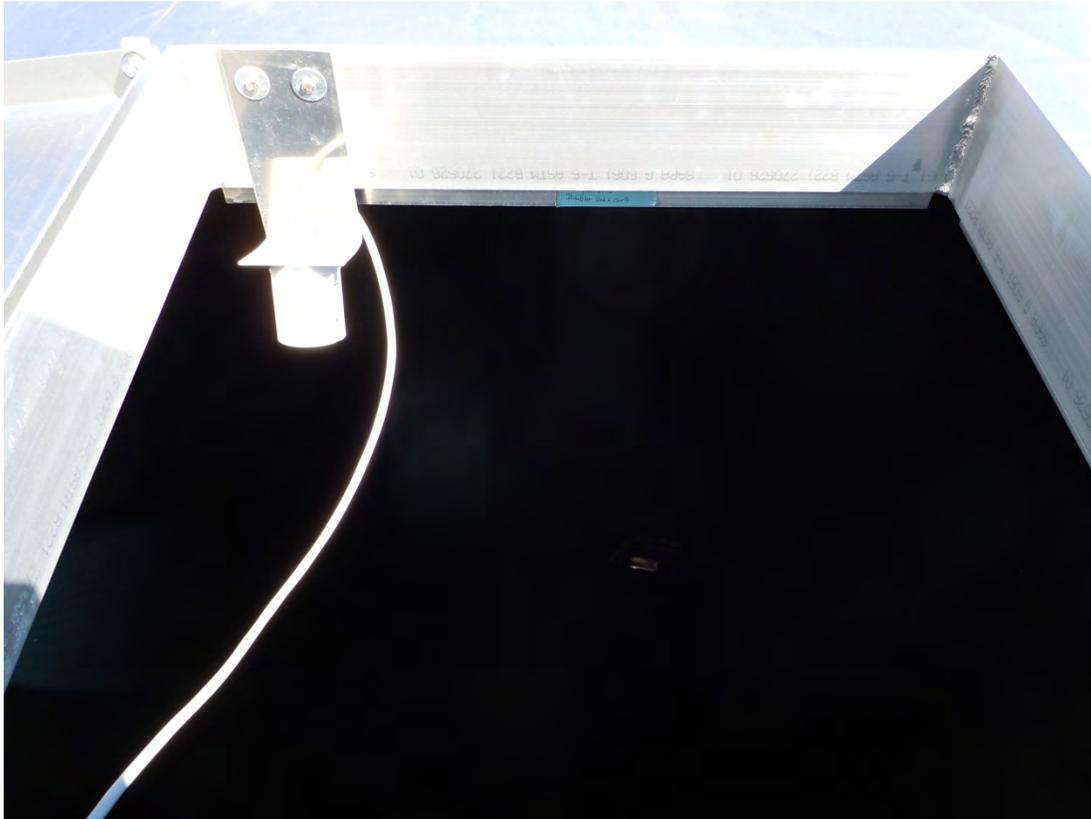
