It's so cool! Are you planning on making the workbooks available for download?               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Not the workbooks, but you can download the screens. Once we have a server license here on site, we may be able to expand the download capabilities. 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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o There's a lot of the same data available, but this is geared towards broader audience.</li> <li>• Is there a lot of user similarity, as in definitions and resources?             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Yes, we've been working with Allison Grace to make sure there are similarities in terminology, etc.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Renee Calanan helped provide a similar demo on the Obesity Networking Call. One of the questions on that call was if there would be any training on this tool once it's rolled out?             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Yes, we are currently creating our training schedule, and developing a timeframe for that as well. We will also be creating a user guide, and webinars to supplement.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Can anyone speak from their specific grant situation at the moment? Can you think of where this might fit in with your work?             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Broomfield - We will be using this with our new coalition that we are assembling. The presentation of the data will make our job much easier.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Anyone on the SIM sector see where this is applicable to their work?             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Tri-County - We may be able to use some of the indicators around screening because we're working on creating a gaps analysis tool.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p><b>Local Updates</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ouray - Attended CEHA and saw the presentation on the medication take-back program. There is a big gap in our part of the state in terms of local law enforcement participation. It's great that this isn't just a one time/year occurrence, and there's a simple application to fill out. We've been encouraging everyone to work with their local pharmacies and law enforcement to apply.</li> </ul>
