


Prevention of Dental Caries in Children Age Birth to Five Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Oral Health (OH) Logic Model

LOGIC ASSUMPTIONS	EXTERNAL FACTORS
<p>Oral health partnerships can help generate and cohesively market a statewide campaign to increase oral health awareness, which directly aligns with Cavity Free at Three's (CF3) focus.</p> <p>CF3 seeks to prevent dental disease in Colorado's children by ensuring medical and dental providers are adequately trained in oral health needs unique to young children and pregnant women. Oral health education for children must start before birth. Pregnant women who receive optimal dental care are more likely to understand the importance of early oral health care for their children.</p>	<p>The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) has named oral health as one of the top 10 CDPHE Winnable Battles and is being addressed by the task group, the Oral Health Winnable Battle Collaborative. This collaborative includes: statewide and local oral health coalitions, statewide foundations, statewide and local nonprofits, local public health agencies, provider associations, safety net associations, educational institutions, state agencies and other key early childhood stakeholders.</p>
