

**Logan County Commissioners Work Session**  
**May 29, 2018**

Chairman Pelton called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

**REVIEW OF BUSINESS MEETING AGENDA** - The Board reviewed the Business Meeting Agenda for the May 29, 2018 meeting.

The meeting recessed at 8:52 a.m. and reconvened at 9:35 a.m.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS SESSIONS** - Commissioner McBride moved to approve the minutes of the May 22, 2018 work session as written. Commissioner Donaldson seconded and the motion carried.

**REVIEW DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES (DHS) SCHEDULE OF BILLS** - Valerie Richards met with the Board to review the DHS schedule of bills dated May 29, 2018. The Board approved all bills as presented.

**REVIEW LOGAN COUNTY SCHEDULE OF BILLS** - Lindsey Reeves met with the Board to review the Logan County schedule of bills dated May 29, 2018. The Board approved all bills as presented.

**REVIEW LOGAN COUNTY SCHEDULE OF BILLS** - Michelle Hoff met with the Board to review the Logan County payroll schedule of bills dated May 29, 2018. The Board approved all bills as presented.

**ATWOOD PROPERTY UPDATES** - Alan Samber noted that the advisement in court is set for June 7 on the Dorsett property. The owner or tenant of the Hwy 6 property is making attempts to clean up the property.

**COURTHOUSE LIGHTING** - Blazen Illuminations has offered a 12 month maintenance plan for the lighting programming at \$225/month. This includes three hours per month which can be rolled over if not used. The Board will review the proposal and schedule for discussion at a later work session.

**CALICHE SCHOOL STUDENTS PAINTING ON ROAD** - Commissioner McBride reported that he had received an anonymous complaint concerning Caliche school students painting on the road. It has been a tradition since the 1980's for graduating seniors to paint their names on the road in front of the school. McBride feels that it is not a county issue but should be a complaint to the Sheriff's Office.

The Board agreed that it does not appear to be vandalism and is not a problem as long as it is keeping with school spirit and does not contain obscenities. It does not appear to be a safety issue, but more a perception of unsightliness for the person complaining.
