Exceptions include Aspirin, Insulin (preferred agents on the PDL) and Plan B products	Required in accordance with current Preferred Drug List and Appendix P criteria
Drugs Covered (active, rebatable, non-unit dose products only) Note: Drugs covered by Part D Plans will not be covered by Medicaid Updated May 28, 2015	Amytal sodium	Medicaid covers any product with a cough suppressant (Antitussive) such as: Codeine; Dextromethorphan; Hydrocodone. Medicaid does not cover any other cough and cold products.	All OTC products in accordance with current Appendix P criteria	Bioflavoniods
