Warner Peak

It was moved by MM and seconded by JW to defer decision.

Grounds: The Board would like to know the opinion of Black Canyon and the Forest Service before making their decision. Also, the board would like to know if Warner Point in \_\_\_\_\_ is named after the same Warner to be commemorated with this peak.

Rotary Peak

It was moved by DW and seconded by MM to recommend against this new name.

Grounds: The proposed name is against the guidelines provided in PPP, as there is no association between the peak and the Rotary. Other features have been used to commemorate

this group. And the board feels broad public support for the new name has not been demonstrated.

#### Mount Belmar

It was moved by GO and seconded by MM to recommend against this new name.  
Grounds: The proposed feature lies within a Wilderness Area. The board feels that the justifications given for the proposed name are not sufficient to warrant an exception to the policy of not naming features in Wilderness Areas.  
Vote 5-0

#### Dragon's Tongue

It was moved by MM and seconded by DW to recommend against this new name.  
Grounds: The proposed feature lies within a Wilderness Area. The board feels that the justifications given for the proposed name are not sufficient to warrant an exception to the policy of not naming features in Wilderness Areas. There is no Park support for the name. And the proposed Dragon's Tongue does not meet the standard criteria of a feature.

#### Burnell Pond

It was moved by DW and seconded by JW to recommend against this new name.  
Grounds: The proposed feature lies within a Wilderness Area. The board feels that the justifications given for the proposed name are not sufficient to warrant an exception to the policy of not naming features in Wilderness Areas. Additionally, the board feels Burnell is more than worthy of commemoration, but that there are features more suitable to commemorate his name than the proposed pond.

#### Meier Ridge

It was moved by MM and seconded by JW to defer decision on this new name.  
Grounds: The board would like to know the opinion of \_\_\_ County and the Bureau of Land Management. The Board will request a brief biography of Robert A. Meier from the proponent, with an emphasis on Meier's contribution to the land. According to guidelines provided in PPP, land ownership is not sufficient justification for a commemorative name.
