

ORDINANCE NO. 249

An Ordinance Concerning the Running at Large of Animals in the City of Las Animas, Colorado, and Providing for the use of certain Streets of the City of Las Animas, Colorado for driving Loose Animals Thereon.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Las Animas, Colorado;

SECTION ONE. That if any resident of the City of Las Animas shall permit any horse, cow, mule, ass, sheep, or goat that belongs to him or is under his charge, to run at large within the City of Las Animas, Colorado, he shall be under conviction, be fined in any sum not less than one (\$1) dollar nor more than twenty-five (\$25) dollars, or committed to jail for not more than ten days.

SECTION TWO. Any ordinance or part of any Ordinance in conflict herewith is hereby repealed.

SECTION THREE. No streets of the City of Las Animas, Colorado, other than the following shall be used for driving loose horses, cattle, sheep, asses, goats, or other live stock; namely,

Cottonwood Ave; Ninth Street; Bent Ave, South from the north limits of the City to Second Street and Bent Ave, north from the south limits of the City to Eighth Street; Eighth Street west from the east limits of the City to Vigil Ave.; and South half of Vigil and St.Vrain Streets between Seventh and Eighth Streets; and Second Street east of Bent Ave.; and Moore Ave.

SECTION FOUR. Any one who shall violate this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of from one (\$1) dollar to fifty (\$50) dollars or imprisonment of from one to thirty days.
