

ORDINANCE NO. 252.

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO PEACE AND QUIET.

Be It, Ordained by the City Council of the City of Las Animas, Colorado:

SECTION ONE: If any person shall maliciously or willfully disturb the peace and quiet of any neighbor^{hood} or family, by loud or unusual noises, or by tumultuous or offensive carriage, threatening, quarreling, challenging to fight, or fighting, every person convicted thereof shall be fined in a sum of not less than ten (\$10) dollars and not more than fifty (\$50) dollars.

Passed by the City Council and approved by the Mayor of the City of Las Animas, Colorado, the 6th day of February, 1922.
