

ORDINANCE 16-A

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE KEEPING AND RUNNING AT LARGE OF ANIMALS AND POULTRY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF STRATTON, COLORADO, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF STRATTON:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Ordinance, the word animal shall include cattle, horses, donkeys, mules, sheep, hogs, goats or rabbits, and the word poultry as used in this Ordinance shall include chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, or other fowl.

Section 2. KEEPING ANIMALS AND POULTRY PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for any person to house, keep, or maintain any animals or poultry within the corporate limits of the Town of Stratton, Colorado.

Section 3. ANIMALS AND POULTRY NOT TO RUN AT LARGE. It shall be unlawful for any person who is the owner or custodian of any animals or poultry to suffer or permit the same to run at large within the corporate limits of the said Town of Stratton, Colorado. Any such animals found running at large may be taken up, impounded, and disposed of by the police department in the manner provided by state law.

Section 4. PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE. Any person who shall violate this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fine in a sum not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Fifty (\$50.00).

Section 5. REPEAL. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, of the Town of stratton inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 6. The Board of Trustees finds and declares that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and therefore, an emergency exists and this Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after publication thereof.

RESOLUTION DECLARING  
ORDINANCE NO. 16-A  
SUSPENDED PENDING  
SPECIAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 16-A of the Town of Stratton, Colorado, prohibiting the keeping of animals and poultry within the corporate limits of Stratton, Colorado, was adopted and passed by the Board of Trustees of said Town on January 4, 1979, and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance was published in the Stratton Press on January 17, 1979, and by its terms was to become effective thirty days from publication of said Ordinance, and

WHEREAS, within said thirty day period a referendum petition was filed with the Town Clerk of said Town of Stratton asking that said board reconsider the Ordinance and rescind said Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the board has determined that the petition and the signatures thereon are proper and genuine, and have reconsidered said Ordinance No. 16A;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by said Board of Trustees of the Town of Stratton that Ordinance No. 16A be and hereby is suspended pending a special election at which time the registered voters of the Town of stratton, Colorado will be entitled to vote to determine whether or not the said Ordinance is to be adopted or rejected.
