

ORDINANCE NO. 22-A

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO CARRYING OR HAVING OPEN CONTAINERS OF MALT, VINOUS OR SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS OR FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGES, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF STRATTON, KIT CARSON COUNTY, COLORADO:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to carry or have any open containers of any malt, vinous or spirituous liquors or fermented malt beverages in any vehicle in the Town of Stratton or on the grounds of any public place or in any public place except in licensed premises in said Town. All law enforcement officers are authorized and empowered to arrest or cause to be arrested with or without process, any persons found violating the provisions of this section.

Section 2. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be punished for each violation by a fine of not more than \$300.00 or by imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. Whereas, in the opinion of the Council, an emergency exists and this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and same is enacted for that purpose, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after publication as authorized.

This ordinance, immediately upon its passage, shall be recorded in the Book of Ordinances of the Town of Stratton, Colorado, authenticated by the signature of the Mayor and attested by the Clerk under the corporate seal of the said Town and shall be published in the "Stratton Press", a public weekly newspaper published within the corporate limits of the Town of Stratton and the County of Kit Carson and the State of Colorado.
