ORDINANCE NO. 63A

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE NUISANCE ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF STRATTON

Whereas, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is for the best interests of the citizens of the Town of Stratton that the nuisance ordinance of the Town of Stratton be amended:

NOW THEREFORE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF STRATTON, COLORADO, ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 59A of the Town of Stratton is hereby amended by addition of Paragraph M., to Section 1. Nuisance as follows:

M. Animals and Poultry Pens and Enclosures. All pens, places, or premises in which any number of animals or poultry shall be kept within the Town so as to be offensive or an annoyance to any person is hereby declared to be a public nuisance. The term animals shall include but shall not be limited to cattle, horses, donkeys, mules, sheep hogs, goats, rabbits and other domestic animals. The term poultry shall include but shall not be limited to chickens, ducks, geese, turkeys, and other fowl.

SECTION 3. The Board of Trustees finds and declares that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and, therefore, an emergency exists, and this ordinance, shall be recorded in the Book of Ordinances of the Town of Stratton, Colorado, authenticated by the signature of the Mayor and attested by the Town Clerk under the corporate seal of the Town and shall be published in the "Stratton Spotlight", a public weekly newspaper published within the corporate limits of the Town of Stratton and the County of Kit Carson and State of Colorado and shall be in full force and effect five days after such publication.
