HQIP - Hospital Quality Incentive Payment Program

- Has approved Breastfeeding measure for 2017!!
- To incentivize and increase the number of Baby-Friendly hospitals in Colorado and align with the Governor's priorities.
- Overview:
 - Hospitals choosing to participate in the program will be reimbursed for improving breastfeeding support at their hospital and pursuing and achieving Baby-Friendly designation!



HQIP - What is it?

- Offered by State of Colorado under Colorado Medicaid
- Using Hospital Provider Fee Program - provides incentive payments to hospitals for improving health care and patient outcomes
- Administered by Dept of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF)
- Hospital Provider Fee Oversight and Advisory Board approved a new performance measure for breastfeeding
- Total funds available for payments in 2016/17 was ~\$90 million. Projected amount for 2017/18 ~\$86 million



HQIP - What is it?

- HQIP incentive payments are based on each hospital's performance on the measures.
- Hospitals report to HCPF on selected measures and data is obtained from Medicaid claims data, Hospital Compare, and other sources.

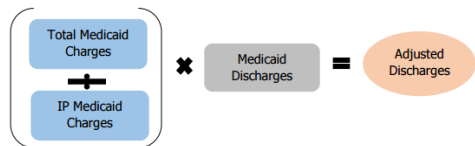


HQIP - Payment Calculation

OVERVIEW: Incentive payments are calculated by annual adjusted discharges, multiplied by the total points earned to provide the total discharge points.

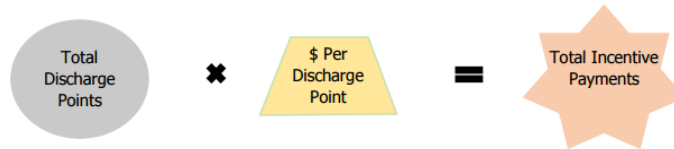


- Adjusted discharges are calculated by dividing the total Medicaid charges by inpatient Medicaid charges and then multiplying by total inpatient Medicaid discharges.



HQIP - How Much \$\$\$

- Total Discharge points are multiplied by the dollars per discharge point to arrive at the total incentive payment.



- The \$ per Discharge point is dependent on the total quality points earned by a hospital. The higher the total quality points, the more money each discharge is worth.

HQIP - How Much \$\$\$

- Based on 2016/17 measures, hospitals could earn anywhere from 0 to 50 points (typically 10 points a measure).

Example: Payment Tiers based on Total Quality Points Earned

Tier	Total Quality Points	Dollar per Discharge Point
1	1-10	\$5.00
2	11-20	\$7.50
3	21-30	\$10.00
4	31-40	\$12.50
5	41-50	\$15.00

The above table shows that if a hospital earned 23 total quality points, the hospital would be paid \$10.00 per discharge point. If a hospital earned 46 total quality points, the hospital would be paid \$15.00 per discharge point.

HQIP - 2017/18 Measures

- I. RCCO (Regional Care Collaborative Organization) and Behavioral Health Organization Engagement (mandatory for all hospitals)
- II. Culture of Safety/Patient Safety (mandatory for all hospitals) (culture of safety; pt safety; documentation)
- III. Discharge Planning (advance care; care transition)
- IV. Cesarean Section
- V. **Breastfeeding Practices**
- VI. Tobacco and Substance Use Screening and Follow-Up
- VII. ED Process Measure
- VIII. HCAHPS
- IX. 30 Day All-Cause Readmission, CMS methodology
- X. Maintenance Measures



HQIP - Proposed Scoring *up to 10 points*

➤ Breastfeeding Practices measure

All hospitals will be required to:

1. Submit calendar year 2017 data for The Joint Commission PC-05 Exclusive Breast Milk Feeding measure (all patients, regardless of payer). Points are for reporting and not based upon hospital's rate.
(3 points)

AND ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:



HQIP - Proposed Scoring *up to 10 points*

2. Written Breastfeeding policies for hospitals not officially on the Baby-Friendly pathway, implementing 5 of the 10 Steps (Can Do 5!). Must provide copy of written policy and statement as to how staff are trained on policy.
(3 points)
3. Hospitals must move from one of the 4-D pathway phases to the next during time period of Jan 1, 2017 and Apr 1, 2018. (4 points)
4. Hospitals officially receiving or maintaining Baby-Friendly designation at some point between Jan 1, 2017 and Apr 1, 2018. (10 points)
