SUBJECT: Documentation for service of goat's milk in the CACFP
TO: Child and Adult Care Food Program institution representatives

This procedure memo regards changes to the documentation requirement for service of goat's milk in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE)-CACFP identified a State definition of goat's milk in the *Colorado Manufactured Milk & Dairy Products Regulations*. This procedure memorandum supersedes CDPHE-CACFP Procedure Memo CENTERS #15-06, FDCH #15-06, ADC #15-03, *Crediting of Goat's Milk*, dated February 10, 2015.

United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) regulations state, "All fluid milk in the Program must be pasteurized fluid milk which meets state and local standards for such milk. All fluid milk must have vitamins A and D at levels specified by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and must be consistent with state and local standards for such milk." According to the *Colorado Manufactured Milk & Dairy Products Regulations*, "The word "milk" shall be interpreted to include goat milk."

Similar to cow's milk, goat's milk is a creditable form of fluid milk that may be served in the CACFP without documentation typically required for milk substitutes. Goat's milk served in the CACFP must meet the same fat content requirements as fluid milk.
