The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Child and Adult Care Food Program (“CACFP State Agency”) announces the release of United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) policy, SP 55-2016, CACFP 26-2016, SFSP 28-2016, *Meal service during unanticipated school and day care closures*.

The attached USDA policy describes flexibilities allowed for CACFP at-risk afterschool programs to offer meals and snacks during unanticipated school and day care closures.
