(1) Insured Unemployment as used in the WIA Dislocated Worker allocation is the number of continued claimants without earnings for the week of the 12th. The data is for the period January through December 2007. This is not the same as the number of unemployed used in the youth and adult calculator—that is based upon a broader estimate of unemployed individuals including those unemployed persons who never file a claim.

(2) Numbers are from the Mass Layoff Statistics (MLS) program compiled by the CDLE for the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The data is for Calendar Year 2007 and is a count of unemployment claims for those layoff events in which 50 or more persons filed an unemployment claim against a single employer during a consecutive 5 week period. Certain layoff events, such as seasonal layoffs, have been excluded from consideration for purposes of this allocation.

(3) This data represents the number of lost jobs in declining comparing State FY 2006 to State FY 2007 (July 1 - June 30).

(4) Farm/Ranch data is provided by the US Dept. of Agriculture. Data shown is for 2007. This is the most recently compiled data available.

(5) UI Claimants with a 15 week or more claim with a benefit year beginning in Calendar year 2007

(6) The federal formula for WIA allocation defines ASU (Areas of Substantial Unemployment) as contiguous areas of 10,000 population or more contained completely within a region's boundaries that average greater than 6.5% unemployment ASU based on total unemployment for PY 2008

(7) Optional federal hold harmless calculated by federal rules to maintain each region at a minimum of 90% of its share of last years funding

Percentages at the top of the data columns indicate the relative weight given each factor. The federal rules for WIA dislocated worker allocation require that all 6 factors be used, but each state can determine the weight they wish to give each factor.
