Angie has sent an email to Melanie Reece @ Health First to clarify RN codes (i.e. 99211) and LPHA exemptions for using this code. You may want to review the May 2016 Title X Billing and Coding Manual to find additional answers to coding questions. This issue has also been added as a potential breakout session for agency fiscal or financial coordinators to attend at the April Women’s Conference. A suggestion from larger FOHCs was to have one provider each day linked to the RN that would be using these codes. The provider greets the client, ensures no further questions, and documents a short note. The agency is then allowed to use the non-RN E/M visit codes for Medicaid reimbursement. Practice management or CLIA proficiencies request for resources- Please see Sections 27 & 28 in the Colorado FP Clinical Manual, starting on page 161 for details on CLIA waived procedures, including testing controls (via package insert). In short, if the test is CLIA-waived, the lab must retain the current package insert or manufacturer’s instructions, and must follow everything within the insert. If the manufacturer requires external (commercial) controls to be tested, lab must follow this requirement.
