Presenters:

Mark Thrun, MD is medical director of the Denver Behavioral PTC, and director of HIV Prevention and STD Control for Denver Public Health. He is also Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. His primary research interests include acute and early HIV infection, the immunology of HIV, and the prevention and diagnosis of HIV infection. He is also actively involved in community planning for HIV services and policy development. Dr. Thrun has recently developed a prevention curriculum for HIV care providers designed to increase the frequency and efficacy of their risk-reduction discussion with patients. He received his doctorate in medicine at the University of Cincinnati and completed an infectious diseases fellowship at the University of Colorado. Dr. Thrun has previously served as co-chair of the National Network of STD/HIV Prevention Training Centers and remains active on its steering committee.

Lauren Mitchell is a public health nurse at Tri-County Health Department where she has worked for the past nine years. Currently she is the Family Planning Program Nurse Manager. Lauren received her Doctorate in Nursing in 2003 from the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. She is a registered nurse with a special interest and background in women's health and international public health. She has worked in public health for over twelve years in areas such as emergency preparedness, nurse home-visitation, women's health, nursing professional development and disease intervention. Lauren has also worked in public health in rural West Africa for three years. She is a certified Lamaze Child Birth Educator and is also certified as a lactation counselor. She teaches classes at Rose Medical Center to expecting parents. Lauren is a graduate of the Regional Institute for Health and Environmental Leadership (RIHEL) and the co-founder of the Colorado Public Health Nurse Practice Council.

Liz Romer, RN, ND, MSN, FNP, Director Family Planning Program, Children's Hospital Colorado
Liz has over 11 year experience in the field of family planning and Title X administration. She holds a BA in Sociology from Wesleyan University and received her Nursing Doctorate and Masters of Science in Nursing from the University of Colorado. In her current position she is able to pursue her passion for young women's health, while exploring innovative new ways of connecting with adolescents and young adults. Liz is a nurse practitioner who splits her time between patient care and program administration. She directs a team of nurse practitioners in four clinic locations in Colorado Springs and the Denver metro area serving over 4000 patients annually. Additionally she recently co-authored an article about Long-Acting Contraceptive Awareness in Adolescents in the Journal of Adolescent Health as well as presented her clinical work on developmental approaches to contraception counseling in adolescent patients at the Society of Family Planning. Prior to accepting her current position in 2010, Liz has worked as a nurse practitioner at the Children's Hospital Colorado in the Section of Adolescent medicine since 2002. Before joining Children's Hospital, Liz worked as an emergency room nurse at Swedish Hospital and Denver General (now Denver Health).
