

Title X: Site Expansion Reasoning

Data Behind the Targeted RFA

Over the past 46 years, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's (CDPHE) has successfully managed the Title X grant in order to meet the family planning needs of low-income Coloradans. Most notably, the Family Planning Program has nationally gained recognition for its substantial decrease in Colorado's unintended pregnancies, teen birth, and abortion rates. Through these great achievements, the State General Fund increased its Family Planning contribution to better serve the family planning needs of Coloradans.

In order to respond to the needs of the state, the Family Planning Program plans to expand Title X services throughout the following regions where there are no current Title X contractors:

Southern region of Colorado: Saguache, Mineral, Rio Grande, Alamosa, Conejos, Costilla, Custer.

Southeast region of Colorado: Las Animas, Otero, Prowers, Baca, Kiowa, Crowley.


Northwest county of Colorado: Garfield County.

The following data, provided by the State, and the Colorado Health Institute, demonstrates how the targeted regions, mentioned above, were chosen and how funding will best reach the contraceptive needs and services of the state through clinics that have high uninsured women below the federal poverty level and no Title X clinics within the county.



Map of Current Title X Clinics




Health Statistics Regions





Percent of Females 15-44 who are Uninsured by County




Number of Uninsured Women in Need of Family Planning, by Region
