

Neil Peck

Neil was initially appointed to the State Personnel Board by Governor John Hickenlooper on June 30, 2013 for a three-year term which ended June 30, 2016. He was reappointed by the Governor to a second term of July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2019. Neil has served as Board Chair since 2015.

Until his retirement in 2018, Neil was Of Counsel to Snell and Wilmer, LLP, whose practice is concentrated in complex civil and criminal litigation, including appeals, involving commercial, trade regulation, environmental, natural resources, white collar criminal defense, and international issues. He represented major American and international corporate clients, including corporate officers, in complex civil and criminal business litigation matters involving issues such as accounting fraud, foreign corrupt practices, environmental, natural resources, antitrust, and false advertising.

A graduate of Tufts University with a major in government and Yale Law School with an emphasis in criminal law, Neil has been a Trustee of the University of Colorado, U.K. Charitable Foundation, and of Graland Country Day School. He has also served as a Visiting Professor of Law at Nottingham Law School and as a Member of the Executive Committee of the CPR International Institute for Conflict Prevention & Resolution based in New York City.

Neil's public service over the last thirty years included serving as Chair of the Colorado Lottery Commission, a Member of the Council on the Arts, and an Honorary British Consul at Denver.
