**Re: Town of Bayfield Lifts Fire Restrictions**

The Town of Bayfield has lifted the emergency fire restrictions put in place on June 11, 2018. The restrictions lifted include:

- 1. Agricultural burning** including but not limited to weeds, brush, or grass.
- 2. Building, maintaining, attending an Open Flame**, including camp fire, stove fire, charcoal grills and barbeques, coal and wood burning stoves and devices (stoves, grills, or lanterns) using liquid fuel such as white gas or kerosene.
- 3. Outdoor Smoking.**
- 4. Use of any explosives materials**, including fireworks, solid fuel rockets, blasting caps or any incendiary device, which may result in the ignition of flammable material.
- 5. Outdoor welding, grinding** or use of any type of torch in any area which presents the possibility of igniting vegetation or other combustible material.
- 6. Operating any outdoor equipment or machinery** in an undeveloped area with an internal combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order.
- 7. Off road use or parking of a motorized vehicle** in an area that presents the possibility of sparks or exhaust heat igniting surrounding flammable vegetation.
- 8. Burning of trash**, refuse or other debris.

Please note that permits from the Upper Pine Fire Protection District are always required to burn waste paper, boxes, brush, leaves, grass, tree clippings or other combustible material outdoors in the town and it is unlawful for any person to burn any hazardous material in the town. Additionally, it is illegal across Colorado to use fireworks which fly through the air, explode or fragment; including cherry bombs, bottle rockets, M-80's and Roman candles.
