Public Input to the [Colorado Commission on Affordable Health Care](#) (CCAHC)

The CCAHC should recommend a “Comprehensive School Health Program”

- Graduation from high school in Colorado is 77.3%, lowest 20 percentile in the nation ([AHR](#))
- Graduation from high school is positively correlated to higher income and better health
- There is a positive correlation between [health and school success.](#) ([PERMA](#))
- Current assessment data in Colorado does not include “school health indexing”
- The CDC offers an elaborate program to any school, “[School Health Indexing](#)”
- The [National Survey of Children’s Health](#), Index for Colorado is 82%
- A “[comprehensive data portal](#)” is needed for school and district accountability
