- Alignment with local public health catchment areas,
- Alignment with the Insurance Geographical Rating Areas,
- Consideration of SEP catchment areas,
- Consideration of CCB catchment areas,
- Other considerations. Please describe.

Background


The original RCCO maps were designed by examining referral patterns, access patterns, provider capacity, public health districts, community input, and population density.

RFI responses received this fall tended to support alignment of BHOs and RCCOs. Client utilization patterns was most frequently mentioned as an important criteria, and alignment with insurance geographic rating areas, SEBs, CCBs and LPHAs were also mentioned. Several respondents advocated combining RCCOs 4 & 7 and for having Larimer and Weld Counties in the same RCCO. Specific counties were mentioned as needing special consideration during the map creation included Larimer, Denver, Weld, El Paso, Pueblo and Elbert Counties.


