

## CO SBHC PERFORMANCE MEASURE CODES

### CHEAT SHEET (updated 07/01/16)

#### **Well-Child Check (WCC)**

Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users, aged 3 to <21 years, seen during the measurement year who had at least one comprehensive well-care visit provided in the past 12 months, at the SBHC, including documentation of: Health and developmental history, physical exam, health education/anticipatory guidance and annual risk assessment.

*These codes will be used to identify users having WCC. SBHC contractors will be asked to report on the Hub how they assure that WCC have documentation of all age-appropriate components.*

#### **BMI Assessment & Nutrition and Physical Activity Counseling**

Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users, aged 3 to <21 years, seen during the measurement year with documentation of the following at least once in the past 12 months:

- BMI percentile AND
- Counseling for nutrition AND
- Counseling for physical activity.

Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users aged 3 to <21 years with BMI ≥85 percentile seen during the measurement year with documentation of the following at least once in the past 12 months:

- BMI percentile AND
- Counseling for nutrition AND
- Counseling for physical activity

**BMI Percentage** - *These codes will be used to identify users having documented BMI%.*

<b>Nutrition Counseling - These codes will be used to identify users having nutrition counseling.</b>

<b>Physical Activity Counseling - This code will be used to identify users having physical activity counseling.</b>		
	Z71.89	Other specified counseling
<b>Chlamydia Screening</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users (all genders) seen during the measurement year identified as sexually active who had $\geq 1$ test for Chlamydia documented in the past 12 months.		
<i>These codes will be used to identify users screened for Chlamydia. The percentage of users who are sexually active will be estimated by Apex based on the most recent Healthy Kids Colorado Survey.</i>		
	Z11.8	Encounter for screening for Chlamydia
	Z11.3	Screening for infections with predominantly sexual mode of transmission
<b>Depression Screening</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users, aged 11 to <21 years, seen during the measurement year with documentation in the past 12 months of screening for clinical depression using an age appropriate standardized tool AND follow-up plan documented if positive screen.		
<i>These codes will be used to identify users screened for depression. SBHC contractors will be asked to report on the Hub how they assure that users with positive depression screen have a documented follow-up plan.</i>		
	G8431	Adolescent depression screen, positive
	G8510	Adolescent depression screen, negative
	99420	Depression screen, still used by private payers
<b>Oral Health Screening</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users, aged 3 to <21 years, seen during the measurement year with documentation of an oral health screen, in the past 12 months, by the SBHC primary care provider <u>OR</u> by the SBHC Dental Provider.		
<i>This code will be used to identify users who received an oral health screen by a primary care provider. SBHCs can instead choose to report annually the number of oral health screens by dental provider using the HUB.</i>		
	D0190	Oral health screening: aged 3-20 years
<b>Annual Adolescent Risk Assessment</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users, aged 11 to <21 years, seen during the measurement year with $\geq 1$ age-appropriate annual risk assessment in the past 12 months.		
<i>This performance measure will be reported on by Apex for SBHCs using the eSHQ. Sites not using the eSHQ can report this measure annually on the HUB. It is the expectation that comprehensive risk assessments are part of an annual WCC.</i>		
<b>Meningococcal Vaccine</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users who have received meningococcal vaccine by their 13th birthday.		
<i>This performance measure will be reported on by Apex through an agreement with the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS).</i>		
<b>Tdap or Td Vaccine</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users who have received Tdap or Td by their 13th birthday.		
<i>This performance measure will be reported on by Apex through an agreement with the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS).</i>		
<b>HPV Series</b>		
Percentage of unduplicated SBHC users who have received three doses of HPV by their 15th birthday (with appropriate spacing between vaccines).		
<i>This performance measure will be reported on by Apex through an agreement with the Colorado Immunization Information System (CIIS).</i>
