June 30, 2012 - New 5 Year CDC Grant Starts



Women's Wellness Connection Program Reach:


Percent of uninsured women aged 40 to 64 and at or below 250% poverty served through WWC Clinical Services program between July 2015 through June 2016 (FY2015-2016)



For each county, percent served and total eligible population are indicated. Percent served includes WWC Clinical Services program and is total clients served divided by SAHIE county population estimate. For some counties, estimate of uninsured women aged 40 to 64 who are at or below 250% poverty is lower than undocumented women estimate for same demographic group. In these instances, county is displayed as "no eligible women." Percent reach in these counties is 100% when a woman was served through the WWC program.

As of May 2017, CQI project is engaged with 41 health systems encompassing 101 clinics

CQI

Since start of CQI work, partner health systems and clinics have seen an additional:

8,020 men & women screened for colorectal cancer

2,692 women screened for cervical cancer

1,366 women screened for breast cancer

Among partner health systems and clinics with improved rates, average increase from baseline to Year 1 reassessment:

37% to 43% for colorectal cancer screening

49% to 53% for cervical cancer screening

47% to 55% for breast cancer screening

Next there was TOP...


Targeted Outreach Program

First cohort of 7 agencies began in December 2014

Southern Ute and Ute Mountain Ute tribes were merged into the program in July 2016

Four additional agencies joined in October 2016

Women reached through TOP



Followed soon after by CCGP...

Care Coordination Grant Program

- FY13 pilot project with two clinics
- First cohort of 14 agencies began in February 2015
- Second cohort of 10 agencies joined in October 2015
- One more agency joined in February 2016
- Last cohort of 3 agencies joined in June 2016
