Winter Driving Tips

- Be sure to keep your windshield wiper fluid reservoir full and carry extra fluid with you
- Roadway conditions can change quickly. Take time to slow down and pay attention
- Don't use cruise control when traveling on snow packed, icy, or wet roads
- Have a scraper, snow brush, coat, hat, gloves, blanket, first aid kit, flashlight, tire chains, matches and nonperishable food in your car
- Make sure your tires have adequate tread and are in good condition

....and please remember to buckle up!

Drive safe this winter with good snow tires!

TREAD CHECKS

Vehicle safety checks will be available from the Vail and Avon police departments between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. To check your treads at home, try the "quarter test." Place a quarter into several tread grooves across the tire. If part of Washington's head is always covered by the tread, you should be fine (approximately 1/8").



CODE 15

Tire condition will be important this winter. CDOT will be requiring 2 wheel drive passenger vehicles to have good snow tires or chains during extreme winter conditions. All-season tires are not considered acceptable during Code 15, only snow tires that have passed the quarter test.
