STATE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE PROGRAM TO PROVIDE OUTREACH EFFORT IN LARIMER COUNTY

On Friday, February 5 and Saturday, February 6, from 9:30 AM-5 PM, staff from the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment's Unemployment Insurance Program will be at the Larimer County Workforce Center offices to answer questions and concerns people may have about Unemployment Insurance.

When: Saturday, February 6, 9:30 AM-5 PM

Where: Larimer County Workforce Center's Loveland Office, 418 E. 4th Street.

Receiving Unemployment Compensation can trigger a variety of questions. Claimants may be confused about how to close or reopen their claim; they may be uncertain about their eligibility for benefits, how long the benefits will last, and how much money they will receive. Obviously, people give little thought to the unemployment insurance program until they have an immediate need to know. The answers to their many questions can be trickier than you might think.

To help people sort out the answers, the Unemployment Insurance Program in conjunction with the Larimer County Workforce Center is offering free counseling regarding Unemployment Insurance issues. Experts will be in attendance to answer questions about specific claims and assist with virtually any general question about Unemployment Insurance in Colorado. They have many years experience in assisting claimants and have an ability to make even the most complex statutes understandable.

This informal session will provide ample opportunity for participants to get their questions answered in a clear and direct manner. The first step in preparing and adapting to the changes created by the loss of a job is to understand the Unemployment Insurance program. Claimants – and anyone who believes unemployment is in their future -- can take that first step by simply stopping by either the Fort Collins or Loveland office of the Larimer County Workforce Center on the day and time listed above.
