CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION **FOR THE PROPOSED WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PROJECT FOR** **THE SOUTH SHERIDAN WATER, SANITARY SEWER AND STORM DRAINAGE** **DISTRICT**

The Water Quality Control Division of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has conducted a review of the proposed water pollution control project for the South Sheridan Water, Sanitary Sewer and Storm Drainage District in accordance with EPA and the State of Colorado procedures for implementing the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) (40 CFR Part 6) and the State of Colorado NEPA-like policy (SRF Operating Agreement). The State has determined that this project is eligible for a categorical exclusion. Accordingly, the State is exempting the project from further substantive environmental review requirements under the above stated policies.

Project Description:

The proposed project is to CIPP line the districts approximate 47,000 feet of sewer mains and 72 sanitary sewer manholes. The project will be funded by a Water Pollution Control State Revolving Fund loan in the amount of \$1,916,075 at 1% interest rate. The project will increase the total user rate by \$11.78 per month to account for both the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund and Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund loans.

Criteria for Granting a Categorical Exclusion under 40 CFR parts 6.107 and 6.505


The action proposed will ensure compliance with current and future wastewater treatment standards. The following criteria condition the allowance of the categorical exclusion for the proposed action:

- The Minor rehabilitation of existing facilities;
- Infiltration and Inflow correction.
