CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION FOR THE PROPOSED DRINKING WATER PROJECT FOR YAMPA VALLEY HOUSING AUTHORITY

The Water Quality Control Division of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has conducted a review of the proposed drinking water project for the Yampa Valley Housing Authority in accordance with Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and State of Colorado procedures for implementing the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) (40 CFR Part 6) and the State of Colorado NEPA-like policy (SRF Operating Agreement). The State has determined that this project is eligible for a categorical exclusion. Accordingly, the State is exempting the project from further substantive environmental review requirements under the above stated policies.

Project Description:

The proposed project consists of replacing the water distribution system within the Fish Creek Mobile Home Park to bring it up to current standards established by Mount Werner Water and Sanitation District, the wholesale water provider.

The project will be funded by a Drinking Water Revolving loan in the amount of \$729,891 at an interest rate of 0%, however, \$486,750 will be forgiven after completion of the project. The project will not require an increase in lot rental rates.

The project, by design, will not increase the drinking water demand for the planning area.

Criteria for Granting a Categorical Exclusion under 40 CFR part 6.204:

The action proposed will ensure compliance with current and future drinking water treatment standards. The following criteria condition the allowance of the categorical exclusion for the proposed action:

1. Minor rehabilitation of existing facilities;
2. Functional replacement of equipment;
3. Minor upgrades and expansions of existing water systems in communities of 10,000 population or less (distribution line extensions are not included).
