Critical Incidents:

On **March 4, 2014**, a female came in to report a domestic violence that had taken place on **March 3, 2014**, between her and her partner. The female reported that an argument took place and she was shoved several times. Sgt. Dawe arrested the alleged defendant at her home. After further investigation, Sgt. Bertolas arrested the reporting female as it was reported that she had started the argument before the shoving match took place. Both females were charged with Domestic Violence – Harassment. On **March 22, 2014** and **March 31, 2014**, one of the females (the original reporting female) reported that the other female was violating the Protection Order. The reporting female was arrested for Protection Order Violation and Violation of Bail Bond Conditions. The second incident was unfounded.

On **March 12, 2014**, Sgt. Dawe was called to the Manhattan Bar for an assault. Deputy Bond located the suspect vehicle. Sgt. Dawe arrived and spoke to the driver and passenger, who matched the description of a man who just hit someone at the Manhattan Bar. Sgt. Dawe placed the men in his vehicle and drove back to the bar where he spoke to the reporting party, an off duty female bartender. She reported that two men came in to the bar. They left and the on duty bartender told her that one of the men walked outside of the bar with a beer. When she went to confront him, he was urinating while the other man was inside of the vehicle. She asked him to give the beer back and he started yelling at her and calling her dirty names. He then hit her and another man knocked him to the floor. The man was charged with Assault, Criminal Mischief, Disorderly Conduct and Public Urination.

On **March 1, 2014**, Officer DeLorme pulled over a vehicle after she saw the female try to drive down Harrison Ave. while it was closed and full of snow for Ski Joring. The vehicle drove south bound in the north bound lane to avoid the closure. The vehicle traveled about a half of a block and then drove into the middle of the road and into the snow. The vehicle increased speed to possibly avoid getting stuck. The vehicle was travelling at a speed fast enough that when it hit the end of the snow, which was about 12" high, all 4 wheels of the vehicle came off of the ground for approximately 5 feet. The female driver was arrested for DUI and Disobeying a Road Closure.

Critical Incidents:

On **April 3, 2014**, Officer DeLorme responded to a call of an unwanted male at a residence saying very vulgar things to the female at the residence. Officer DeLorme went to the suspect's residence and knocked at the door. The suspect told Officer DeLorme to enter and when she did not he threatened to kill her. She immediately called for backup. After backup arrived Officer DeLorme made contact with the suspect and noted a strong odor of alcohol on his breath. Officer DeLorme was able to get him to come outside and place him under arrest. The suspect was transported to SVGH for a medical clearance and a mental health evaluation. Officer DeLorme was met at SVGH by Chief Leake and later by Sgt. Bertolas and Officer Hanson. They too were verbally abused by the suspect. The suspect had to be monitored over-night by Sgt. Bertolas and she endured several hours of verbal abuse and threats by the suspect. The suspect was charged with Assault, Harassment, Trespass, Resisting Arrest and Disorderly Conduct.

On **April 5, 2014**, a woman called dispatch to report that two people, who had been living with her, had stolen her debit card. Officer Hanson took the report and suspect description. Transactions were placed on her card through-out Leadville and Lake County. On April 7, 2014 Sgt. Dawe located the two suspects (one male and one female) and they were charged with Theft and Unauthorized Use of a Transaction Device.

On **April 11, 2014**, Officer DeLorme responded to a residence for an agency assist for Lake County Sheriff's Office Deputy Basile on the report of a man hitting someone with a baseball bat. When Officer DeLorme arrived a man had the suspect restrained on the ground and Deputy Basile told the man he could let go of the suspect. There was a bat a few feet away from the suspect, his hands were in latex gloves and covered in blood and there was a Durango with windows busted out. The suspect would not cooperate with Deputy Basile and kept trying to stand up. The man got to one foot and Officer DeLorme and Deputy Basile ended up deploying their Tasers at the same time. The suspect complied and was placed in handcuffs by Undersheriff Mendoza. When they tried to place the suspect in Deputy Basile's patrol vehicle, he became

combative again. Officer DeLorme placed her Taser on the suspect's shoulder while Undersheriff Mendoza, Deputy Basile and Sgt. Bertolas tried to get the suspect under control. He was eventually restrained.

On **April 20, 2014**, Sgt. Bertolas was dispatched to a fight in progress and an unconscious male in the road at the Silver Dollar Saloon. When Sgt. Bertolas arrived, she observed a man sitting on the curb holding his face. He was bleeding, one of his teeth appeared to have been knocked loose and he was intoxicated. The male refused to tell Sgt. Bertolas what had taken place. After speaking to the bartender and a couple of patrons, it was found that a male suspect had punched the male in the face after some words were exchanged. The injured male fled from the ambulance while he was being examined and the male suspect was charged with Assault and Disorderly Conduct.

On **April 22, 2014** Officer Marusarz was dispatched to Kum & Go for a fight in progress. The suspect had assaulted his wife and tried to throw her out of a vehicle as well as assaulted and threatened to shoot a man who tried to help her. The suspect was charged with Domestic Violence-Assault, Violation of a Protection Order and Reckless Endangerment.

On **April 29, 2014** a man called the Police Department to discuss an ongoing domestic violence situation with his girlfriend. Chief Leake asked him to come in and speak to him about it. Chief Leake obtained an arrest warrant for the female suspect and she was later charged with Domestic Violence - Assault.

Critical Incidents:

On August 6, 2014 at 0024 hours dispatch aired a call of shots being fired. A cover car from the Sheriff's Department was requested. When officers arrived there were five men either in the house or on the lawn. It was also dispatched that one of the men outside had a gun for protection but he was not the shooter. The officers cleared the house and cuffed everyone for their protection and for officer protection. While handcuffed one of the men jumped on one of the other men. The officers then set some of the men in separate patrol cars. It was determined that one man had fired several shots while inside the residence. One man was arrested and charged with Felony Menacing, Illegal Discharge of a Firearm, Prohibited Use of Weapons, Disorderly Conduct and Reckless Endangerment. Another man was arrested and charged with Harassment and Resisting Arrest.

On 08/21/2014, at approximately 2110 hours officers were dispatched on a report that a man had been assaulted by a female. The man told officers that the female had scratched him and punched his truck. The subject was bleeding from his face and neck. The subject then said the female ran into an apartment screaming that he was hurting her. The female said that while they were driving around he got angry with her and he asked her to get out of the truck. When she started to get out he accelerated the truck as she was trying to exit it, she scraped her ankle and fell backwards into the truck. She said that after she bounced out of the truck he got out of the truck and kicked her in the right side twice. She said that after he kicked her she ran into the apartments and asked the tenant to call 911 for her. After investigating, and given the physical evidence, the female was arrested and charged with Domestic Violence and 3rd Degree Assault.

On 08/26/2014, officers were informed of a report in reference to a domestic violence, assault in the third degree, violation of a protection order, and violation of bond conditions that had taken place in Leadville. Officers were contacted by a Victims Advocate reporting that a female had been assaulted on 08/26/2014. During our interview with the subject she showed us the bruises on her right check and right eye, which were consistent with someone hitting her in the face. The case will be left open pending warrant arrest.

Critical Incidents:

On 09/03/2014 at approximately 09:00 hours an officer responded to 220 East 4th Street with the Leadville Fire Department for the report of a possible house fire. Upon arrival smoke was observed coming out of the front eaves of the house, in the attic area. Once the fire department made initial entry into the house they advised the officer there was a marijuana grow operation inside which occupied 2 rooms. They also advised there appeared to be fire smoldering in the insulation in the attic. The renter was contacted and he stated he has rented the house for about a month. He stated he went in on the house together with 2 of his friends to split the cost and they all have medical marijuana cards. He stated no one lives in the house, they just were growing in it. Inside of the house the officer observed 2 separate grow rooms and a lot of various equipment. Both rooms had black plastic over the entrances. The first room had approximately 83 plants in it varying from seedlings to plants about 20" tall. The next room had 7 mature plants which were around 24-30 inches tall. In total there were 90 plants in the house.

On Saturday, September 27, 2014 at about 0526 hrs, an officer was dispatched to a residence on W. 5th Street on a report of a possible overdose. Dispatch advised that there were 2 males in a running vehicle, non-responsive. After arriving on scene the officer heard loud music playing from a running vehicle. The officer approached the driver side door and opened the vehicle. Inside the officer saw the driver in the driver seat holding an open beer in his hand. The officer tried to shake the driver awake but failed. The officer checked for a pulse and found one. The officer was able to wake the driver. The ambulance crew went to the passenger seat and found a 17 year old juvenile male also holding a beer. Because of his age he was transported to the hospital. I asked the driver if he had been drinking. He said he was. The officer asked him if he

would be willing to do voluntary physical maneuvers to prove to the officer that he was safe to operate a motor vehicle. He declined. The driver had watery, bloodshot eyes, he was unsteady on his feet, he also had an odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage on his breath. The driver registered at .155 BAC. The driver was charged with Driving Vehicle while under the influence of alcohol, Drove Vehicle with excessive alcohol content > .08, Open Alcoholic Beverage Container and Contributing to the delinquency of a minor. F4.

On September 9, 2014, at approximately 2041 hours, an officer was dispatched to Mt. Massive Drive on a report of a possible domestic dispute in progress. The officer was advised a neighbor had called and reported yelling and loud banging. Upon the officer's arrival she observed a male pull the curtain to the side on the large front window and look out. He quickly left the window and was not see again. When she began knocking on the door she was able to see into the apartment through the front window where the curtain had not been pulled back. She observed a female come from the stairway crying and holding the back of her head. The victim opened the door and the officer immediately observed a large lump on her forehead, just left of center. The officer asked her where the suspect went and she said she thought he was upstairs. After clearing the house the suspect was not located. Later, the suspect was located and is being held at Lake County Jail on the listed charges on NO BOND, Assault in the Second Degree F6, Criminal Mischief M1, Violation of Protection Order X2 M1, Violation of Bail Bond X2 M1, and Domestic Violence.

Critical Incidents:

On **May 19, 2014**, A suspicious package was mailed from B&B Shipping via UPS from Leadville to an address in North Dakota. The package had a strong odor of marijuana coming from the package. When the package was picked up by UPS they were alerted to the suspicions and the package was confiscated at the UPS warehouse in Summit County. After thorough investigation, on June 13 there were simultaneous search warrants executed by the Leadville Police Department, Lake County SOG team and Chaffee County Swat team on two residences. Various items were seized, resulting in the arrest of two people with charges of Unlawful Distribution, Sale, Unlawful Possession, and Child Abuse.

On **June 8, 2014**, Sgt. Bertolas and Detective Wineman responded to a call at 200 Harrison Avenue of two men fighting. Upon arrival they found two very intoxicated males who had been fighting. The stories of these men changed several times of what happened. They also talked to the residents in the apartment these two men came from and there were numerous people and many versions of what happened. There was damage done to the apartment and blood smeared on walls. Both men were taken to the hospital for medical clearance. Charges were not filed at this time as this case needs further investigation.

On **June 18, 2014**, Sgt. Dawe, Officer Mitchell and Chief Leake responded to a call of two drunk men fighting on East 5th Street. When they arrived there were three intoxicated men and one small boy at the residence. Medical assistance was called. One man was taken to the hospital with injuries and one man was taken to the hospital for a medical clearance and then transported to the Lake County Jail.

On **June 24, 2014**, Sgt. Dawe was contacted by Officer Anthony Martinez of the Aurora Police Department regarding a warrant for a Leadville resident for impersonating a police officer, there was nationwide extradition for this warrant. Officer Martinez and Sgt Dawe went to the residence and arrested the suspect. She was transported to the Lake County Jail.

Critical Incident:

On 12/12/2014 Officers responded to a residence in the City of Leadville, for the report of a couple arguing and the male party wanting a standby. The officers were met at the door by the defendant who stated he had been arguing with his girlfriend and he wanted us there so he didn't get in trouble for anything. During the entire contact the defendant was extremely rude and belligerent. He continued to cuss and carry on in a very loud manner. The female packed up a few things and took the children and left. The defendant stated you guys can get out of my house too. The defendant told us we were not welcome in his house and we could not come back in either. Later in the evening the female was with another party, as the parties tried to leave their location the defendant was in his vehicle and started following them in a reckless manner. They called 911 and while on the phone the defendant cut them off on two separate occasions, almost causing an accident and continued to follow them extremely close and in an unsafe manner. They were both scared for themselves and the children, and felt threatened. Both of the children, ages 2 and 5 months, were in the vehicle during the entire incident. Officers were able to pull over both vehicles. During the entire contact the defendant was very agitated and uncooperative yelling and cussing as officers tried to interview everyone involved. The defendant was taken into custody and transported to the jail without further incident.
