**Q:** Can CEO confirm if we can apply for funds for an EVSE station in this round of funding as it will be co-located at the CNG station supported by a prior funding round?

**A:** Yes. Previously-funded CNG fueling sites are eligible to submit an additional application for co-located EV fast charging during this round.

**Q:** Is the \$50k a per unit or a per project value [for co-located EV charging], i.e. if 2 chargers were installed would the maximum potential be \$100,000?

**A:** Awards for co-located EV fast charging are capped at \$50,000 per location and cover up to 80% of equipment costs.

**Q:** If we were to apply just for the EVSE portion, how much of the grant packet would we need to complete? As the collocated CNG station has already passed in a prior application, would you just need the EVSE form on the Colorado Energy Office website.

**A:** Applicants must fully complete the downloadable document labeled “EVSE Application Form (Optional)” located at <https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/energyoffice/alt-fuels-colorado-grant-funding-rounds>. Any unanswered or partially answered criteria and/or questions will be counted against the proposal.

**Q:** If a station is already under construction is it eligible for funding?

**A:** No. ALT Fuels Colorado station grants are available only for new construction projects.

**Q:** If the equipment has already been purchased but not installed is it eligible for funding?

**A:** No. All equipment purchases claimed under the ALT Fuels Colorado grant program, whether claimed directly or as a project match, must be made and installed within the duration of the contractual agreement with the State of Colorado.



**Q:** Is there a minimum required distance between fueling facilities to be eligible for funding?

If so, is that distance driving?

**A:** There is no minimum required distance between fueling facilities. However, the Colorado Energy Office will prioritize tier I and II funding areas as defined within the ALT Fuels Colorado Corridor Investment Plan, located on the Colorado Energy Office website under Transportation > ALT Fuels Colorado > Publicly Accessible CNG Stations. CEO will also remain open to discussions pertaining to additional locations.
