Snow Removal In the City of Leadville, CO



Code of the West

Leadville receives, on average, more than 100 inches of snow per year. Snow is one of the most magical, and challenging, aspects of living in Leadville.

Our City crew is very good at what they do, however, there are limitations to what

is possible at any given time. Our crews work long hours to keep streets clear of

snow and safe for cars and pedestrians.



City Responsibilities

We work hard to clear all city streets in a timely fashion.

We inform the public of specific, time sensitive snow hauling priorities, through signage.

We strive to ensure safe routes for driving and walking.

We deposit excess snow out of traffic patterns as fast as we can.

We sand streets for safety.

We follow City Codes for snow removal.



Personal Responsibilities

Please keep your sidewalks and parking areas clear and safe for your family and visitors alike.

Please move vehicles (including trailers)

off of the streets when posted for clearing.

Please shovel or plow your snow into your

yard, if at all possible.

Please wait to shovel your parking area

until *after* the street crews come by (this might save you some aggravation).



Please do not shovel or pile snow into the

street or onto fire hydrants.

Please do not pile snow on sidewalks, as

per City of Leadville Code.

Snow Removal Times and Reasons

Snow removal typically begins on most

mornings when snow accumulates at least

2 inches, by 3 am. While operation is

noisy, it is necessary to perform such work

in the early morning hours, before periods

of heavy traffic.

It is the goal of the Street Department to

clear all city routes quickly and efficiently

with emphasis on major routes, emergency

routes, schools, and safe routes to schools.

Civil Discourse

Be polite in your communication with neighbors and local

government. We are all dealing with snow and the issues which arise.

Be open to new ideas.

Have a cooperative spirit in your

neighborhood. Help each other and come up with clever ideas for snow removal.

Communicate. Take time to have adult

conversations about your issues...don't let concerns fester until you feel trapped

by a situation.

Enforcement

If your street is posted for clearing, all

vehicles and objects are expected to be moved. Postings take place by noon the

day before clearing.

Please park cars within one foot of the

Cars must be moved on a regular basis

(every 72 hours).

Failure to comply may result in ticketing

and/or towing.
