1. **Call to Order** Frank Huitt called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
2. **Roll Call** Frank Huitt, Ann Brady, Andrew Shaffer and Kristin Steele present, Joseph Nielsen, Dan Eddy and Lisa Hatch absent. Also present, Peter Brixius, Lisa Piering, Mike Englert, Jocelyn Mullen, Don Reed, Naomi LeGere and John Whipple.
3. **Invocation** Peter Brixius lead the invocation.
4. **Pledge of Allegiance** Peter Brixius lead the pledge of allegiance.
5. **Minutes of Meeting**
 - a. *Approval of the minutes of the July 28, 2015 meeting.* Motion to approve the minutes of July 28, 2015 made by Ann Brady, seconded by Andrew Shaffer, motion passed.

10. **Supervisor Reports – See Attached**
 - a. *Mike Englert – Building & Grounds Supervisor - Mike Englert updated the council on WRV apartment renovations one was for a handicapped resident, we also had a failure of installation done years ago on a shower unit in another apartment; the breezeway is 90% complete with just a few minor finishes. The patio has been torn out and replaced on the back of buildings B & C at WRV, crews are working on finishing the waterline repairs remediation. They have finished concrete projects by the museum and also a small project by Bank of the San Juan's. We have been removing dead and hazardous trees along the streets in Town, this will be a great improvement for safety and appearances within the Town. Tree dump has not made any burns because of weather conditions and we will probably wait until the snow comes to do that. Mosquitos and fogging has been one of the best years for pest control, we have tried to become a*

little more proactive in using insecticide in the storm drains which has helped control the adult mosquitos. Mike just ordered supplies for our truck fogger and is working to keep up with problematic areas like the schools and the golf course and parks. The council questioned what the airplane sprayer is using, he is basically using a Malathion type of product because of the feedback that he received in past years. Mike said he can try to target areas if they know there is a problem. John Whipple asked where he does spray and what his area of coverage is. Peter responded that he flies over the outlying areas of Town, up and down the river and wet areas between the Dam and just west of Town limits and does not directly spray in neighborhoods and said he would talk to the pilot about the areas he's spraying and that there has been some issues lately with mosquitos in town.

- b. Lisa Piering – Town Clerk – Lisa Piering provided more information about the Caselle XpressPay software upgrade. It will mostly be for online payments and we are hoping to see an increase in our cash flow and a great service to provide our customers. Marybel Cox went to The Fundamentals of Government Accounting training class since she has been taking over a lot of the things that Lisa used to do. Lisa went to an Election training class and there are changes again for this coming election that will change some of the deadlines before and after the election. We are starting to get quotes for health insurance. CIRSA and Pinnocal are recommending companies try and implement a Health and Wellness Program to help with costs. Centurylink is completing an audit of our telephone system. We will be starting to work on the Budget for the upcoming year.*
- c. Jocelyn Mullen – Town Planner - Updated the council on phase 2.5, preconstruction meeting this morning with the contractor, and the concrete contractor, along with the structural engineer. We are very excited to open up the plant and evaluate the problems and come up with solutions for why the plant is settling. We did give the contractor a change order for additional days for the roof repairs.*

11. Reports from Officers – Town Manager Update - *Peter Brixius apologized for the delay in the board packet because of the timing of the projects we needed to approve. The CML district meetings are coming up on Sept 9, Peter, Lisa Hatch and Joe Nielsen will be attending. Chevron will be dedicating the Raven A1 on the 15th of September. Urie has completed the soil remediation at the 5S site, which was much larger than was originally thought to have been needed. Instead of 300 tons being hauled to the landfill we had to haul 900 tons. There is also a lot of concrete to remove off of the lot as well. The building & grounds crews will continue to work on that in the next week. There will be some quarterly water sampling over the next two years at the site. The total cleanup costs of the site will exceed \$750,000 over 10 years. There was a meeting with the county to review the fiber installation within the*

Town. They have awarded the bid to H&C Contractors for the installation of the fiber and their start date will be around the 24th of August and will be here until December 1st. They will be working concurrently with the crews as we complete waterline replacement on La Mesa and Hillcrest. There will be 12-15 crew members from H&C that will be staying in Town for the next 2-3 months along with some additional engineering and geotechnical staff. Notices will be going out to all residents on La Mesa and Hillcrest Circle about the waterline projects that will begin next week. We have hired two new dispatchers. Sales tax numbers for June came in about 24% less than this time last year at \$67,500. He believes that is largely due to a single oilfield related contributor. Peter passed out the natural gas consumption statistics as prepared by the Gas Department over the last 10 years. Forecasts are predicting an increase in moisture this fall and into winter which will impact gas usage in the next six months. The roof replacement at Water Treatment Plant will take 2 weeks which will start in September. Frank asked when we will get our dispatch fully staffed so that we will be able to keep our dispatch duties here. Peter stated that it will be 3 months to get our newest members trained and we still need a fifth to be fully staffed to cover the schedule.

12. New Business

- a. *Discussion and Action to Approve the July 2015 Check Register.* Motion to approve the July 2015 Check register made by Kristen Steele, seconded by Ann Brady, motion passed.
- b. *Discussion and Action to Approve the lowest responsive waterline proposal from Upland Construction for the construction and replacement of water main and services for determined sections of La Mesa Circle, Vista Circle, Hilltop Drive, Hilltop Court, Hillcrest Avenue and Hillcrest Circle in the amount of \$315,347 with a \$30,000 contingency for a total of \$345,347.* Mike Englert reviewed the proposals, he reminded everyone Jocelyn went through the whole bid process to complete this task. All of the contractors are qualified and Upland came in with the lowest bid. Our experience with Upland has been good and we feel very comfortable with his crew. We are looking at late October to early November dates on asphalt. Once we start waterline we will lay the line of the road and off one side of center and electric and fiber lines will be on the opposite side of the roadway. We are going to mill the whole road out due to the extensiveness of the cuts required for fiber, gas lines and electric. Everyone is geared up and ready to go. Frank asked if the crews would be staying locally and Mike said yes especially with the timeline constraints they will probably be working Monday through Saturday from 7am-5pm. Frank asked what the coldest temperature that asphalt can be laid. Mike responded around 40 degrees and up should work. Once you start getting into the 30's there can be some problems laying the asphalt. United

companies felt comfortable with a warm asphalt product which isn't too expensive if we have to resort to that.

Motion to approve the Waterline proposal from Upland in the amount of \$345,347 for 2015 waterline projects as scheduled made by Andrew Shaffer, seconded by Kristin Steele, motion passed.

- c. *Discussion and Action to Approve the lowest responsive asphalt milling proposal from Mountain Valley Contracting for La Mesa Circle, Vista Circle, Hilltop Drive, Hilltop Court, Hillcrest Avenue and Hillcrest Circle in the amount of \$18,680 with a \$5,000 contingency for a total of \$23,680. Mike said that the milling contractor will start on Monday morning the 17th and should be done within the week, Moon Lake will be making a bore while the milling contractor is tearing up the road, the waterline crews will move in shortly after. We want to drop the milling in place to keep the dust down and maintain a passable route. Motion to approve the asphalt milling proposal from Mountain Valley Contracting in the amount of \$23,680 made by Andrew Shaffer, seconded by Ann Brady, motion passed.*
- d. *Discussion and Action to approve the lowest responsive concrete proposal from May's Concrete in support of the waterline project and the car museum parking construction in the amount of \$53,000. Mike said that as soon as the waterline contractor is complete with cuts on sidewalks May's will move in and repair the damages made while the project is in progress. All the pans need to be redone on La Mesa due to the tie-ins. We have one drain that will need to go in by the post office boxes on La Mesa Circle. On Hillcrest Circle there are some curb and gutter corrections that need to be made to control water and snow removal. Also, some drainage issues at the bottom of the circle as well. Planter sections that Bud Striegel is working on by the car museum, the raw water line will be brought into that area so that we can water the shrubs on Stanolind. Anything next to the car museum is being watered by the Striegel's. We will get permission from Scott Carmichael to get in and complete the project. Motion to approve the concrete proposal from May's Concrete in the amount of \$53,000 for the waterline project and the car museum parking project made by Kristin Steele, seconded by Andrew Shaffer, motion passed. (Peter wants to point out that we have the two action items D & F, the concrete in the combined bid on D is the concrete that is within the \$30,000 improvement for the car museum parking lot. Peter said we bid all the concrete on one bid to get the best price for the three projects. After the council discussed it they decided to change the amount on item F to reflect the remaining cost of the project less the concrete.)*

- e. *Discussion and Action to approve the waterline materials proposal from Grand Junction Pipe for both La Mesa and Hillcrest waterline projects in the amount of \$82,522 with a \$5,000 contingency for a total of \$87,522. Mike stated that the materials for this project were quoted and ready to mobilize the materials upon our approval. Motion to approve the proposal from Grand Junction Pipe in the amount of \$87,522 for the La Mesa and Hillcrest waterline projects made by Andrew Shaffer, seconded by Kristin Steele, motion passed.*
- f. *Discussion and Action to approve the 5S Station Parking Lot improvements for 2015 with an estimated cost of \$30,000.00. After the above discussion the Council amended the amount on item F to reflect the actual cost of the improvements in the amount \$7,260. Motion to approve the 2015 5S Station parking lot improvements additional costs in the amount of \$7,260 made by Kristin Steele, seconded by Ann Brady, motion passed.*
- g. *Discussion and Action to approve the budgeted Caselle XpressPay Accounting upgrade for finance in the amount of \$5000.00 for online payment and billing services. Motion to approve the Caselle XpressPay Accounting upgrade in the amount of \$5,000 for online payment and online billing made by Ann Brady, seconded by Andrew Shaffer, motion passed.*




