This major wastewater treatment facility is scheduled for completion in 2020 and will allow us to reclaim the existing sewer lagoons as a water feature for Phase 2 of the park.

I would also like to reiterate Eric's plea for water conservation. This has been a terribly dry winter and spring, so we all need to conserve.

Message from the District Manager Eric Hassel:

The Purgatory Metropolitan District has a busy summer ahead, with several projects planned to be completed. Our biggest project for this summer is the connection of our new water source to the potable water system! Construction will begin in the early spring. As you proceed throughout the community please be aware of construction activity, on roadways, trails and open spaces.

This summer please remember that we just experienced one of the driest winters in many years here in Southwest Colorado, so as you visit the Purgatory Community Please Keep Water Conservation in mind and reduce consumption as much as possible. A faucet with a slow leak (100 drops a minute) will waste 350 gallons of water in one month, a fast stream such as a running toilet can waste up to 4600 gallons in a month. Here are Some ways you can help to conserve water: Turn off the Faucet while brushing teeth and shaving, do not use the Toilet as a trash receptacle and please DO NOT Flush any Type of Wipes! Be sure to turn off faucets completely and repair any leaking water fixtures
