

seventy-five ten thousandths (0.9375) of one cubic foot of water per second of time, or so much thereof as shall be necessary to irrigate said 75 acres of land; that said ditch draws its supply of water from Hard-scrabble Creek; and that its headgate is on the west side of said creek at a point whence the center of section 14 in Township 20 South of Range 69 West bears South 20 degrees and 30 minutes East a distance of 626 feet.

No. 2—The Conley Ditch.

That said ditch and The Burdick Ditch are, together entitled to Arkansas priority No. 2, which is also Beaver Creek Priority No. 1, that John C. Palmer is the owner of said ditch; that it is used for the irrigation of 45 acres of land belonging to the said Palmer; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch continually during the irrigation season for the use of said Palmer and his heirs and assigns, under and by virtue of said priority No. 2, one and eight tenths (1.8) cubic feet of water second of time.

No. 3—The Burdick Ditch.

That said ditch and No. 2, The Conley Ditch, are, together entitled to Arkansas River Priority No. 2, which is also Beaver Creek priority No. 1; that the claimants thereof are George H. Toof and J. A. Toof, each of whom owns an undivided one half thereof; that said ditch draws its supply of water from Beaver Creek; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of twenty (20) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use of the said owners thereof, under and by virtue of priority No. 2, one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during
