

is used for the irrigation of 62 acres of land, of which 38 acres belongs to said Leorux, 6 acres to said Callen and 18 acres to said McCurry; it is also used to supply sufficient water to the Callen Ditch to irrigate 23 acres of land now being irrigated from said Callen Ditch by said Callen; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Leroux and Callen, proportionate to the number of acres they respectively irrigate, under and by virtue of said priority No. 4, continuously during the irrigating season, one and thirty-six hundredths (1.36) cubic feet of water per second of time; that there be allowed to flow into said Callen Ditch from said Glendale Ditch for the use and benefit of said Callen, under and by virtue of priority No. 8, continuously during the irrigating season, the further amount of ninety-two hundredths (0.92) of one cubic foot of water per second of time; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, continuously during the irrigating season, for the use and benefit of said James S. McCurry, under and by virtue of said priority No. 26 the still further amount of seventy-two hundredths (0.72) of one cubic foot of water per second of time. The total amount of water to which this ditch is entitled, including the amount allowed to flow from it into the Callen Ditch, is three and four-tenths (3.4) cubic feet per second of time.

#### No. 6—The Stephen Frazier Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 5, which is also Beaver Creek priority No. 3; that said ditch takes its water from Beaver Creek; that the claimant and owner of said ditch is John Pierce; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Pierce, under and
