

ity No. 17; that said ditch draws its supply of water from said Arkansas River; that its headgate is located South 80 degrees and 30 minutes East, 648 feet, from the South West corner of section 31, Tp 18 South, Range 70 West of the 6th P M; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of two thousand acres of land, part of which lies within the town of Canon City, and also for domestic purposes by said town of Canon City; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 17, for the use and benefit of the persons entitled thereto in the irrigation of land irrigated therefrom, constantly ninety-six (96) cubic feet of water per second of time, or such greater quantity as shall be required for the irrigation of two thousand (2000) acres of land.

No. 18—The Baltiff Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 18, which is also Beaver Creek priority No. 7; that said ditch is owned by John C. Palmer; that it takes water from Beaver Creek; that it is used for the irrigation of 40 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 18, for the use and benefit of said John C. Palmer, one and six-tenths (1.6) cubic feet of water per second of time, the same to flow continuously during the irrigation season.

No. 19—The Johnson Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 19 and 24, same being Beaver Creek priorities Nos. 8 and 10; that the claimants thereof are John Pierce, who owns an undivided one half, Jacob A. Betts, who owns an undivided three eighths, and
