

the use and benefit of said Jesse Rader, constantly during the irrigation season, the further amount of thirty-two hundredths (0.32) of one cubic foot of water per second of time.

No. 22—The Toof Ditch No. 1.

That this ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 23; that said ditch is owned by George H. Toof and J. A. Toof; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 20 acres of land; that said ditch takes its water from Beaver Creek and that it is entitled to Beaver Creek priority No. 9; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 23, for the use and benefit of the owners thereof and their heirs and assigns, one cubic foot of water per second of time for such time and times as shall be necessary to properly irrigate said 20 acres of land.

No. 23—The Johnson and Merit Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas priorities Nos. 25 and 109, which are also Beaver Creek priorities No. 11 and 24 respectively; that the owners of said ditch are William M. Johnson and Thomas E. Merit, each of whom owns an undivided one half thereof; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch under and by virtue of said priority No. 25, for the use and benefit of said Johnson, one cubic foot of water per second of time for and during such time and times as shall be necessary to properly irrigate nine (9) acres belonging to said Johnson; and said cubic foot of water be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority said No. 109 for such additional time and times as shall be necessary to properly irrigate eleven (11) acres of land belong-
