

ing to said Thomas E. Merrit and four (4) acres of land belonging to said Johnson; that the total number of acres of land irrigated from this ditch is twenty-four (24), and the total amount of water to which it is entitled is one cubic foot per second of time for and during such time and times as is sufficient to irrigate said 24 acres.

No. 24—The Morey Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 27, which is also Beaver Creek priority No. 13; that said ditch takes its water from Beaver Creek; that the owners of said ditch are Joseph McGowen, who owns an undivided one-fourth, Alexander Curtiss, who owns one quarter thereof in his own right, and one quarter of one quarter as son and heir of Joshua Curtiss, deceased, and Mrs. Martha C. Curtiss, who owns one quarter as widow and heir of said Joshua Curtiss, deceased, and Ephriam Curtiss, Augustus Curtiss and J. Delbert Curtiss, each of whom owns one quarter of one quarter as son and heir of said Joshua Curtiss, deceased; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of ninety-five (95) acres of land; and there be allowed to flow into said ditch, continually during the irrigation season, under and by virtue of said priority No. 27, for the use and benefit of the persons entitled thereto, three and eight tenths (3.8) cubic feet of water per second of time.

No. 25—The Burroughs Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priority No. 28, which is Hardscrabble priority No. 4; that said ditch is owned by Henry M. Burroughs; that its water is taken from said Hardscrabble Creek; that its headgate is located at a point on the West side of
