

Ripley is the owner of said ditch; that its headgate is situate on the West side of said creek at a point in the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Sec. 16, Tp. 21 South, Range 70 West, whence the South West corner of said tract is South 25 degrees West, distant 16 chains; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 15 acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 39, for the use and benefit of said Ripley, one cubic foot of water per second of time for such time and times as shall be necessary to properly irrigate ten (10) acres of land; that said cubic foot of water per second of time be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of said priority No. 320, for the use and benefit of said Ripley, for such additional time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of two (2) acres of land; and that said cubic foot of water per second of time be allowed to flow into said ditch, under and by virtue of priority No. 370, for the use and benefit of said Ripley, for such additional time and times as shall be necessary for the proper irrigation of three (3) additional acres.

No. 38—The Harrington Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 40, 99 and 133, which are also Hardscrabble Creek priorities Nos. 7, 21 and 27 respectively; that Jacob A. Betts is the owner of three eighths of said ditch, William Smith one eighth, and The Florence Oil and Refining Company three eighths; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of 100 acres of land belonging to said Betts, 120 acres owned by said Smith, and 201 acres owned by said The Florence Oil and Refining Co.; that said ditch takes its water from Hardscrabble Creek, and its headgate is located
