

ditch takes its water from Hardscrabble and that its headgate is located on the East side of said creek at a point whence the South East corner of Sec. 23, Tp. 20 South, Range 69 West bears South 19 degrees and 15 minutes East, distant 381 feet; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use and benefit of said Henry Burroughs, under and by virtue of said priority No. 43, one cubic foot of water per second of time during fourteen (14) days out of every thirty-two (32) days, this ditch to be used, as far as possible, at times when the Burroughs Ditch and the Tanazzi Ditch are not entitled to water under this decree, but, otherwise, the times to be selected by the party entitled to this ditch.

No. 43—The Reece Ditch.

That said ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 44, 94 and 134, which are also Hardscrabble priorities Nos. 10, 20 and 28; that William A. Watson is the owner of one half of said ditch, and Livera Bowers is the owner of one fourth thereof, and S. W. Bernard is the owner of the other one fourth thereof; that said ditch takes its water from Hardscrabble Creek and its headgate is located on the East side of said creek, in the County of Custer; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of ninety acres owned by said William A. Watson, forty-five acres owned by said Livera Bowers, and of seventy acres owned by said S. W. Bernard; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Watson, under and by virtue of said priority No. 44, one and one eighth ($1\frac{1}{8}$) cubic feet of water per second of time or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the irrigation of ninety acres of land; and that there be, further, allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and
