

benefit of said Livera Bowers, under and by virtue of said priority No. 94, the further quantity of fifty-six hundred and twenty-five ten thousandths (0.5625) cubic feet of water per second of time, or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the irrigation of forty-five acres of land; and that there be still further allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Bernard, under and by virtue of said priority No. 134, the further quantity of eight hundred and seventy-five thousandths of one cubic foot of water per second of time, or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the irrigation of seventy acres of land.

No. 44—The Thomas Johnson Ditch.

That this ditch is entitled to Arkansas River priorities Nos. 45, 106 and 365, which are Eight Mile Creek priorities Nos. 3, 5 and 11 respectively; that said ditch is owned by Thomas J. Tong; that said ditch takes its water from Eight Mile Creek, and that its headgate is situate on the South bank of said creek South 34 degrees and 39 minutes West 1367.6 feet from the N. E. corner of the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 22, Tp. 18 S., R. 69 West; that said ditch is used for the irrigation of forty-four (44) acres of land; and that there be allowed to flow into said ditch for the use and benefit of said Tong, under and by virtue of priority No. 45, one cubic foot of water per second of time for such time and times as shall be necessary for the irrigation of fifteen (15) acres of land; that there be allowed to flow into said ditch, for the use and benefit of said Tong, under and by virtue of priority No. 106, constantly during the irrigation season, the further amount of one cubic foot of water per second of time; and that the cubic foot of water first herein decreed to this ditch, under priority No. 45, be
